MATCH PREVIEW – Michael Duffy

Tonight's meeting of Bray Wanderers and Shelbourne is the 60th meeting of the sides in all competitions.

Shelbourne are unbeaten in the last five league games against Bray Wanderers. Wanderers last league win over Shelbourne was a 2-1 win in Tolka Park in May 2013 with goals from Kieran Marty Waters and John Mulroy.

This season is only the second time in eight seasons that the sides have been in the same division.

Shelbourne come into tonight's game top of the first division and unbeaten in their ten league games to date. They have played six home games and only four away compared to Bray Wanderers who have played only four home games and six away games.

Bray Wanderers have won one, drawn two and lost once at home this season in the league. Shelbourne have won three and drawn one of their four away league games this season.

The sides played out a thrilling 3-3 draw in the first meeting of the sides this season at Tolka Park in April.

Shelbourne and Bray have the joint best record for the least goals conceded this season in the First Division with both sides only conceding nine goals from their ten league games to date.

Shelbourne started the season with two draws and are on a great run now having won their last four league games and have won seven out of their last eight league games this season.

Wanderers good run of three successive victories and five games unbeaten came to an end with a late 0-2 defeat away to Treaty United in the Markets Field a fortnight ago.

Ex-Wanderers Ryan Brennan is top goal scorer for the Reds this season having netted seven league goals this campaign.

Wanderers found themselves two goals down inside the opening eleven minutes of this premier division encounter against the league champions.

Owen Heary opened the scoring on seven minutes with a delightful header from Bobby Ryan's corner. Four minutes later, Ryan robbed Andrei Georgescu in midfield and advance to the left-hand corner where he crossed to Glen Crowe who backheeled into Chris O'Connor's net.

Shelbourne were well on top, and Chris O'Connor was forced to dive at Alan Moore's feet to deny the Shelbourne defender a third.

Wanderers then started to come into the game with Eamon Zayed in particular creating problems for the visitors. Former Bray striker Jason Byrne forced O'Connor to parry a great drive.



Glen Crowe blasted over from close range a minute into the second period. Zayed then shot just wide at the other end.

Wanderers pulled a goal back on 66 minutes. Stephen Fox played a pass to Zayed, who rounded Fleming and lobbed the ball over the advancing Dean Delaney.

Wanderers found a new lease of life and were rewarded nine minutes from time. A cross from Colm James found Colm Im Tresson who rounded Ollie Cahill and fired past Delaney.

Zayed almost got a winner for Bray from a short free kick from Ciaran Ryan but fired just over.

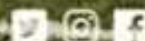

Mark Byrne

Mark played schoolboy football with Crumlin United before moving across channel to Nottingham Forest in July 2007. He made two league appearances for Forest before going on loan to Burton Albion where he made 7 league appearances.

Further loan moves saw him move to Rushden & Diamonds (42 league apps, 6 goals) and then Barnet (28 league apps, 6 goals). He made the permanent move to Barnet in 2011 and made a further 199 league appearances (13 goals) in three seasons there.

Mark then had spells with Newport County (88 league apps, 6 goals) and Gillingham (136 league apps, 8 goals).

He was Newport County's player of the season in 2015/16 and he was Gillingham's player of the season in 2017/18.

Mark returned to Ireland in 2020 and made 10 league appearances for Shelbourne last season in the Premier division.

He joined Bray Wanderers in February 2021 and has been ever present in the right back position all season.



QUIGLEY'S WORLD OF FOOTBALL

"A Shropshire Lad" By Brian Quigley

Where were you on 09 April 1975? Not born yet? Can't remember? I know where I was – I was at home watching Nationwide on BBC. A few weeks shy of my sixth birthday, a feature on Fred Davies the boating ball boy of Shropshire side Shrewsbury Town stuck in the memory, so much so that when I watched the clip decades later on the internet, it was just as I remembered it.

The clip is only four minutes long and interweaves the story of Fred Davies retrieving stray balls from the River Severn – which was behind Shrewsbury's old Gay Meadow stadium – with a progress report on Alan Durban's side as they got closer to promotion from the 1974-75 Fourth Division.

Fred was carrying on in his father's footsteps. Between them they had decades of service retrieving balls that had gone out of the stadium from play using a coracle, a small watercraft first designed by ancient Britons. In the clip Fred is seen sitting with the backroom staff, beside the dugout. A ball goes out during the game against Newport County, and Fred picks up the coracle and walks around the touchline to the access point to the Severn, to the cheers of the crowd. Within ten minutes he's back with the ball, saving his club £15, an amount not to be sniffed at for a Fourth Division side in 1975.

The clip is a glorious reminder of simpler times and is

as poetic to me as anything in A.E. Housman's 'A Shropshire Lad'. Fred Davies was a Shropshire lad, happy to serve his club in return for a small per-ball fee and free entrance to every Town home game.

As far as I can tell Fred continued retrieving balls from the Severn until the early 1990's, by which time he was in his 80's. I'm not sure whether he had retired by the time the other Fred Davies arrived at the club; the other Fred Davies being of course the club's successful 1990's manager, winner of the 1993-94 Division Three championship with the club, and the first man to bring Town to Wembley [for the 1995-96 Football League Trophy final, which they lost to Rotherham United].

Gay Meadow is no more, and Shrewsbury now play at the Montgomery Waters Meadow. Retrieving balls from the Severn isn't an issue at the new ground. Thankfully, Fred and his coracle are remembered – it is on display in the corner of the stadium's Sovereign Suite, having been retrieved from the National Football Museum in Manchester.

Retrieving balls from the River Dargle isn't as big an issue for Bray Wanderers, but balls do stray from the Carlisle Grounds onto Seymour Road, Seapoint Road, Quinsboro Road and of course, the D.A.R.T. line! Enjoy the game today.

Busmen's Mid-Season Break

Mícheál Ó hUanacháin looks at the busy time Wanderers' No 1 keeper had during the recent break

Some of the Wanderers squad had a busy mid-season, with defender Andrew Quinn called into the Ireland Under-19s camp, and goalie Brian Maher jetting off to sunny Marbella for the Under-21s.

Marbella Football Center – which is actually in Puerto Banus, rather than the nearby holiday destination for the well-heeled – is well known by now as a venue for pre-season and other senior football training visits, but this year it's especially busy.

No fewer than five Olympic squads were there this month, as well as three national senior teams, with Norway playing both Luxembourg and Greece in friendlies.

The Olympic squads, all Under-23s, were the 2012 Gold medallists, Mexico (although it's unlikely any of the London heroes were still eligible!), Argentina, Australia, Romania and Saudi Arabia.

So while our attention was largely on our fellow U21s squads, a true football junkie could have attended as many as a dozen internationals at different levels inside a fortnight!

Brian Maher was thrown in at the deep end, starting the first of their three international friendlies, in which they lost 2-0 to a Swiss side who were experienced if a little off their best of a decade ago when they made the playoffs twice and were runners-up against Spain in 2011.

The opening goal was bundled in by Leonidas Stergiou, a regular with the newly-crowned Swiss champions St Gallen, just inside the quarter hour mark, and early in the second half, Kastriot Imeri launched a raid from near half-way, but was halted by a late challenge by Festy Ebosele. The referee played advantage, allowing substitute Gabriel Barès to fire inside Maher's near post.

But the Bray keeper made several crucial saves in the course of the match, including a brilliant one-handed save by Maher from a close-range volley by Christopher Lungoyi just after the hour. The Irish side created a number of good chances, without managing to finish them off.

With two other keepers in the squad, there were no guarantees for the Bray stopper, but Manager Jim Crawford selected him again for the match against the Australian Olympic squad. "In an even contest," to quote the Socceroos' own website, "that saw both sides head into the break scoreless, a Jay Rich-Baghuelou own goal and a 90th minute Ross Tierney header cancelled out a moment of magic from the A-League-based winger", Ramy Najjarine who scored in the 72nd minute.

That sums it up, but for Maher it was a little more than that: "To win the way we did, with Ross scoring with his first touch, everyone was on such a massive high. If you look at that game we controlled a lot of it, we had a set-back but we responded well and those are the moments where you see our character growing – those are the things we're looking for."

A very strong Danish side were the final friendly opponents for the Irish, even though it was a sort of 'second team' for the Danes. At least two of them had also been in Székesfehérvár, White Castle, a little east of Lake Balaton in central Hungary, a week earlier, when Rasmus Carstensen started, and Nikolai Baden Frederiksen sat it out on the bench as their team went out of the strange 2021 UEFA U21 Championship at the Quarter-Final stage on penalties to the ultimate winners, Germany.

Jim Crawford made five changes for the match, but one of them saw Dan Rose make his debut at that level, leaving Maher on the bench. Though he acquitted himself well, Rose acknowledged that it was a big step up from his last international experience at U17. And undoubtedly the save of the game was made by Mark McGuinness, who rose high on the line to head away a stormer of a shot from William Bøving Vick with Rose stranded outside the far post.

Mention of the Olympic squads in Marbella reminds us that the Olympic games are still set to open late next month in Tokyo, despite medical and public opinion there being strongly against them. The women's soccer competition opens the previous day, and the two competitions will end on the 7th and 8th of August.

Apart from the very first games in 1896, football has been an Olympic sport at every regular tournament since – with the sole exception of the 1932 Games in Los Angeles, when FIFA withdrew the event from the schedule, to avoid undermining its own new World Cup.

That was all about the protection of standards, the international association claimed, with the International Olympic Committee's insistence that all competitors be amateurs sitting uncomfortably beside FIFA's energetic championing of the professional game: amateur players could not represent the highest levels of skills and competitiveness, they said.

After the gap in 1932, Germany was keen to have soccer back for the 1936 Olympics, but the competition was marred by controversial refereeing and pitch invasions (among other distractions), and the revival of both World Cup and Olympic football after the Second World War saw the "amateur" tournament losing interest and status, and without the enthusiastic support of FIFA it would be going nowhere.

The dominance of the state-sponsored but technically amateur players of the Soviet bloc countries led to the IOC deciding that for the 1984 Games (coincidentally also hosted by Los Angeles) they would admit professional players – only to see FIFA dilute the

tournament again by insisting that teams from UEFA countries, and from CONMEBOL, the South American federation, could only use players who had not appeared at a World Cup!

An uneasy compromise for the next Games in 1992 saw the introduction of an age limit: male competitors must be under 23 years old (since 1996, up to three over-age players per squad). Since then, UEFA has drawn its entrants from the immediately preceding Under-21 Championships.

That match against the Australians is interesting for another reason, too: the last time Bray had a keeper on international duty, it was "Skippy", the much-loved young Australian goalie Chris O'Connor, who flew back to Darwin for the national Under-23 side, which was preparing for the 2008 Olympics in a very similar sort of camp. Chris lined out in a friendly there against Chile, a 1-1 drawn game in which he was impressive, but not enough to nail down a final selection spot.

And this year is the first time Australia have qualified for the Olympic football tournament since then. We can only wish them better luck than they had in Beijing, failing to get through their Group stage against Argentina, Ivory Coast and Serbia (though they held the last to a 1-1 draw).

THE CARLISLE GROUNDS GROUND REGULATIONS

Entry to the ground is subject to acceptance by the visitor of these Ground Regulations. Entry to the ground constitutes acceptance of the Ground Regulations, and this shall apply in respect of all events within the Ground.

"Ground" means the Carlisle Grounds and all locations owned, occupied or utilised by Bray Wanderers Football Club.

"Events" means any event taking place at the Carlisle Grounds. "BWFC" means Bray Wanderers Football Club.

1. Permission to enter the or to remain within the Ground (notwithstanding possession of any ticket) is at the absolute discretion of BWFC, any member of Garda Síochána or authorised steward. On no account will admission to any Event be granted to any person not in possession of a valid ticket. On no account will admission to a Football match be granted to a person who is the subject of a current banning order.
2. BWFC excludes to the maximum extent permitted by law any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property in or around the Ground.
3. No guarantees can be given to BWFC that an Event will take place at a particular time or on a particular date and BWFC reserves the right to reschedule the Event without notice and without any liability whatsoever.
4. In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Event, refunds (If any) should be claimed in accordance with the relevant event organiser's ticket terms and conditions. BWFC will have no other liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited) loss of enjoyment or travel costs.
5. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge BWFC's right to search any person whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search
6. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground – knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground.
7. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
1. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment, or any such banners or flags, is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
- 8 Conviction of any of the following may result in a banning order being made –
 - 8.1 The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse
 - 8.2 The chanting of anything of an indecent or racist nature.
 - 8.3 The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse.
 - 8.4 Attempting to enter the Ground or being inside the ground whilst drunk.
 - 8.5 Being in possession of any intoxicating liquor or can or other portable container and which could cause damage or personal injury, when entering the ground or in public area of the Ground from which the event can be directly viewed.
9. All persons entering the Ground may only occupy the seat/area allocated to them by their ticket and must not move from any one part of the ground to another without the express permission or instruction of any steward, officer of BWFC and/or any member of An Garda Síochána.
10. Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.
11. The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and like places is strictly forbidden. Nobody entering the Ground shall be permitted to climb any structures within the Ground.
12. Smoking in No-Smoking Areas is strictly forbidden.
13. Mobile telephones and other communications devices are permitted within the Ground provided that they are used for personal and private use only.
14. Any individual who has entered any part of the Ground designated for the use of any group of supporters to which they do not belong may be ejected from the Ground either for the purpose of their own safety or for any other reason.
15. No person (other than a person who holds an appropriate licence) may bring into the Ground or use within the Ground any equipment which, is capable of recording or transmitting (by digital or other means) any audio, visual or audio-visual material or any information or data in relation to the Event or Ground. Copyright in any unauthorised recording or transmission is assigned to BWFC.
16. No goods (including literature) of any nature may be offered either free or for sale by any person within the Ground without the express written permission of BWFC.
17. Tickets are not transferable and may not be offered for sale without the prior written permission of BWFC. Any tickets offered for sale may be confiscated by any steward or officer of BWFC or any member of An Garda Síochána.
18. At all times while present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward and/or member of An Garda Síochána. Failure to comply with any instruction may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.
19. BWFC reserves absolutely the right to eject from the Ground any person failing to comply with any of the Ground Regulations or whose presence within the Ground is, or could, reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. This could lead to further action including, but not limited to, a ban from the Ground or proceedings being taken.
