




Club legend Kieran "Tarzan" O'Brien will be Vincent Kirwan's co-commentator on LOI.TV for tonight's game. Kieran made 374 appearances for Wanderers between 1993 & 2006 and is second in the clubs all time goalscoring charts on 90 goals, six behind Jason Byrne.

## MATCH PREVIEW - Michael Duffy

Bray Wanderers are unbeaten in their last four league games against Cobh Ramblers with three of those four games ending in draws.

Cobh have failed to win at the Carlisle Grounds in their last 11 visits in all competitions having secured just three draws and losing eight of those games. They have drawn on their last two league visits to the Carlisle.

Wanderers are unbeaten at home to Cobh Ramblers in their last 14 league games with eight wins and six draws at home to the Ramblers since their last home league defeat. Cobh's two league wins at the Carlisle Grounds both came in season 1990/91.

Cobh come into tonight's game on a good run of form that has seen them win three of their last four league games.

Cobh have won four, drawn two and lost seven of their 13 league games this season. Their wins have come over Wexford FC (twice) and a surprising 2-1 away win over UCD in the Belfield Bowl in June.

Of their six away games to date they have won two, drawn one and lost three times.

Killian Cooper, Jake Hegarty & Ciaran Griffin are joint leading goal scorers on three goals apiece this season.

Cobh have added two new players to their squad yesterday following the opening of the summer transfer window on July 1. Striker Danny O'Connell joins from Avondale United and midfielder Nathan O'Connell joins from UCC.

Bray Wanderers have won two, drawn two and lost two of their six home league games this season. Bray have kept seven clean sheets from their 13 league games this season and have recorded back-to-back clean sheets in their last two games.

The sides drew 1-1 earlier this season in St. Colman's Park with Brandon Kavanagh scoring for Bray and Charlie Lyons equalising for Cobh from the penalty spot

This was Cobh's opening game of the 2004 season with their original opening day fixture away to Finn Harps having been postponed.

Wanderers had suffered a disappointing start to the season the previous week having been defeated 2-0 at home by UCD on the opening night of the season.

Both sides threatened early, with a Bray free kick inside the first minute having to be cleared away by Kieran O'Reilly and Jody Lynch's third minute shot, despite a deflection, going out off the post for a corner.

Just after the quarter hour, Robbie McGuinness's free kick found Graham O'Hanlon, who volleyed to the net to put the visitors ahead.

Cobh put Bray under pressure and Chris O'Connor had to look lively to clear after a rare Maurice Farrell error.

Bray struck for a second two minutes before the break. Ciaran Ryan broke free downfield and squared for Kieran O'Brien to score.

The start of the second half saw yellow cards for James and Gormley for Bray and Andrews for Cobh as the game threatened to turn nasty.

Ciaran Ryan headed a free kick from McGuinness off the Cobh crossbar. Wanderers went three up on 68 minutes when Kevin Grogan tapped in from close range after been set up by Stephen Gifford.

Four minutes from time Colin James ran in and fired low past Cuthbert for Wanderers fourth.

A minute into added time Steve Yelverton picked out James Cummins on the edge of the area and he fired low to the Bray net for a consolation goal

# **QUIGLEY'S WORLD OF FOOTBALL**

#### "You can call me Al" By Brian Quigley

I met Alan Curbishley once. It was some time in the late 1990's, when his Charlton Athletic side were in Bray for a pre-season friendly against Bray Wanderers. I remember that his name was on the team sheet, which I found odd because he had retired from playing years earlier, to concentrate on management [he was player-coach and player-manager at Charlton in the early 1990's, before hanging up his boots in 1993 to concentrate fully on managing The Addicks, initially as co-manager with Steve Gritt]. In the end, Alan didn't play in Bray that day!

I found him a quiet, modest man at the time. I had been familiar with him for two decades at that point, from his lengthy playing career that started in 1974 at West Ham United and took in spells at Birmingham City, Aston Villa, Charlton Athletic [twice] and Brighton & Hove Albion.

Breaking into the West Ham squad in the 1970's was no mean feat. The fact that Curbishley was a midfielder made his achievement all the more remarkable, when you consider the talent The Hammers had in midfield at the time – Trevor Brooking, Alan Devonshire, Pat Holland, Geoff Pike and Billy Bonds. Opportunities were limited, not surprisingly, and this together with a falling out with John Lyall [West Ham's manager at the time] led to Curbishley moving on to start the journey that would eventually lead him to The Valley.

Few players who have had successful playing careers go on to become successful managers. Many of the best managers were average players at best, and many of the best players make average managers, at best. Curbishley was an exception, a very good player who went on to become a very good manager.

During 15 years in charge of Charlton, Curbishley took them up to the Premier League [twice] and established them at football's top table. Between 2000 - when they came up for the second time during his tenure, and 2006 - when he departed, the side were regular finishers in the top half of the table. The club finished ninth in 2001 in their first season back up, and by 2004 were pushing for a Champions League spot for most of the season before finishing seventh. Happy Valley.

By 2006 Curbishley had brought Charlton as far as he could. He was in the frame for the England job to succeed Sven-Goran Eriksson, having been in the frame for the Liverpool job in 2004. Stupidly – and to their eternal shame – the FA opted for Steve McClaren. Curbishley took the West Ham job but left after a couple of years when top players were sold against his will, and against the terms of his contract. Since then, he has had roles at Fulham, but not the top job, preferring to stay in the background and do some punditry work [something he is excellent at].

I never knew – until I sat down to write this piece – that Alan Curbishley was related to Bill Curbishley, the film producer and band manager. Bill is 15 years senior to Alan and managed The Who, Judas Priest and former Led Zeppelin band mates Jimmy Page and Robert Plant. He produced the 'Tommy' film for The Who, and also managed tours for Thunderclap Newman and Golden Earring. A legend, like his brother.

The 2021/22 season will see Charlton rename their East Stand as The Alan Curbishley Stand. An honour Alan fully deserves.



#### The Women's Game - Part 1

The Bray Women's teams were unlucky on this, the first occasion the club had fielded two girls' XIs, in both being drawn to play Peamount United. Peamount are hugely experienced, and though the membership of squad's changes, the institutional memory and the morale boost of a well-stocked trophy cabinet continue to have an effect.

It's not the first time Bray have faced the Peamount ladies, however. The then Bray Wanderers Ladies, playing in the Dublin Womens Soccer League Premier Division in 2010, had home and away fixtures against them.


But that was the year the Peas, with Aine O'Gorman and Bray's own Katie Taylor in the squad, won the treble: the DWS League, the DWSL Premier Cup and the FAI Women's Cup. They went on to finish second in their group at the UEFA Women's Champions League and, as the best runners-up, qualified for the Round of 32. They were the first Republic of Ireland team to qualify for the knockout stages of any European competition.

2010 was a vintage year for women's football at international level too. The Republic of Ireland U-17s finish as runners-up in the UEFA Women's Under-17 Championship and as quarter-finalists in the FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup.

And it was the year the Women's National League was being planned, almost 130 years since the first recorded women's game in Britain, when 'Scotland' beat 'England' 3-0 at Easter Road in Edinburgh. Many of the women played under false names, in view of the potential for public shame!

It took a little while, but the first fully reported women's game took place in 1895, when the deliciously named Nettie J Honeyball's British Ladies' Football Club took to the field.

"Nettie" was actually Jessie Allen Smith, aged 24 when she advertised for and brought together a group of women in the London area who were interested in soccer. Her brother-in-law, Alfred Smith, acted as organiser for the club, and travelled with them on occasion.

The following year, on 23 March 1895, the club fielded two teams, tagged 'North' and 'South', at the Nightingale Lane Ground, Crouch End in North London, for an exhibition match in which North beat South 7-1. The event attracted a reported 10,000 spectators – and very mixed reviews.

The Sketch newspaper described the play: "For the most part, the ladies wandered aimlessly over the field at an ungraceful jog-trot." The Jarrow Express remarked sardonically "The members of the British Ladies' Football Club have played their first match in public. We hope ... it will be their last."

It wasn't – but sadly the group fell foul of a very Irish problem. Nettie and another player, "Mrs Graham" (Scotswoman Helen Graham Matthews, who had arranged the 1881 Easter Road game), fell out, and the first ladies team to visit Ireland was the one subsequently organised by the latter, who played three games at Cliftonville in June, after an 'England v Ireland' match earlier that month at Moville, Co Donegal.

On 19 May the following year, Nettie's club played an exhibition among themselves at the City and Suburban Ground, Jones's Road, and four days later a match at the same venue against a team of 'Dublin Gentlemen', which the ladies won 7-2.

The crowds across Britain for the ladies' games, however, gradually fell away, and the novelty seemed to have worn off. It took the outbreak of the Great War, nearly twenty years later, to spark a revival, originating in women's involvement in the industrial workforce while the men went off to the colours. The works teams, some called Munitionettes after the products they were making, became highly popular in the absence of the Football Leagues, and raised huge sums for charities.

In this period, the first significant women's international was played on St Stephens Day 1917 at Grosvenor Park in Belfast. The newspapers of the time billed it as such, Ireland v England, though other sources name the teams as North of Ireland Ladies and Tyneside Ladies. 20,000 spectators saw the Irish lose 1-4.

One of the best known wartime clubs came together in that hothouse of English football, Preston. They were girls who worked at the Dick, Kerr & Co. factory, and were sometimes called "Dick Kerr's Ladies", the missing comma suggesting that a real person called Richard Kerr was in charge. They played many games at Deepdale, and featured a teenage prodigy called Lily Parr, who scored freely throughout a 32-year career.

But when they continued their sporting activities after the end of the war, attitudes to the women footballers began to change. Criticism grew, with warnings on morals and disparagement of the quality of the games, and commentary ranging from outrage to sarcasm, with added leers and sniggers.

During the summer of 1920 Belfast Celtic director Hugh McAlinden arranged a tour involving a ladies' team from France to play in both Belfast and Dublin. But time was running out for the women's game.

Though hostility to it was most virulent in England, there were Irish detractors, too: a correspondent to the *Southern Star* in July 1921 averred that women might play sports, but only before marriage, and another in the *Sunday Independent* later that year said "a lady in knickers racing up a field is a most ungainly sight".

But more pressing for the administrators of the game was the threat the women's game posed, instanced by the St Stephens Day 1920 match between Dick, Kerr's and St Helens Ladies at Goodison Park. Over 53,000 people watched; an estimated 14,000 others failed to gain admittance.

Thoroughly spooked by the huge numbers and its continuing popularity, the FA launched a propaganda campaign, including medical opinions that the game was "much more harmful to women" with injuries "from which they may never recover", and "too much for a woman's physical frame."

Finally, on 5 December 1921 the FA issued a 'request' to all member clubs to refuse the use of their grounds for women's games, and barred members from acting as referee or linesmen at such matches. It sent the women's game underground, not to re-surface for half a century.



# THE CARLISLE GROUNDS GROUND REGULATIONS

Entry to the ground is subject to acceptance by the visitor of these Ground Regulations. Entry to the ground constitutes acceptance of the Ground Regulations, and this shall apply in respect of all events within the Ground.

"Ground" means the Carlisle Grounds and all locations owned, occupied or utilised by Bray Wanderers Football Club.

"Events" means any event taking place at the Carlisle Grounds. "BWFC" means Bray Wanderers Football Club.

- 1. Permission to enter the or to remain within the Ground (not withstanding possession of any ticket) is at the absolute discretion of BWFC, any member of Garda Siochana or authorised steward. On no account will admission to any Event be granted to any person not in possession of a valid ticket. On no account will admission to a Football match be granted to a person who is the subject of a current banning order.
- 2. BWFC excludes to the maximum extent permitted by law any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property in or around the Ground.
- 3. No guarantees can be given to BWFC that an Event will take place at a particular time or on a particular date and BWFC reserves the right to reschedule the Event without notice and without any liability whatsoever.
- 4. In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Event, refunds (If any) should be claimed in accordance with the relevant event organiser's ticket terms and conditions. BWFC will have no other liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited) loss of enjoyment or travel costs.
- 5. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge BWFC's right to search any person whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search
- 6. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground
- 7. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
- 1. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment, or any such banners or flags, is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
- 8 Conviction of any of the following may result in a banning order being made -
- 8.1 The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse
- 8.2 The chanting of anything of an indecent or racialist nature.
- 8.3 The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse.
- 8.4 Attempting to enter the Ground or being inside the ground whilst drunk.
- 8.5 Being in possession of any intoxicating liquor or can or other portable container and which could cause damage or personal injury, when entering the ground or in public area of the Ground from which the event can be directly viewed.
- 9. All persons entering the Ground may only occupy the seat/area allocated to them by their ticket and must not move from any one part of the ground to another without the express permission or instruction of any steward, officer of BWFC and/or any member of An Garda Siochana.
- 10. Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.
- 11. The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and like places is strictly forbidden. Nobody entering the Ground shall be permitted to climb any structures within the Ground.
- 12. Smoking in No-Smoking Areas is strictly forbidden.
- 13. Mobile telephones and other communications devices are permitted within the Ground provided that they are used for personal and private use only.
- 14. Any individual who has entered any part of the Ground designated for the use of any group of supporters to which they do not belong may be ejected from the Ground either for the purpose of their own safety or for any other reason.
- 15. No person (other than a person who holds an appropriate licence) may bring into the Ground or use within the Ground any equipment which, is capable of recording or transmitting (by digital or other means) any audio, visual or audio-visual material or any information or data in relation to the Event or Ground. Copyright in any unauthorised recording or transmission is assigned to BWFC.
- 16. No goods (including literature) of any nature may be offered either free or for sale by any person within the Ground without the express written permission of BWFC.
- 17. Tickets are not transferable and may not be offered for sale without the prior written permission of BWFC. Any tickets offered for sale may be confiscated by any steward or officer of BWFC or any member of An Garda Siochana.
- 18. At all times while present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward and/or member of An Garda Siochana. Failure to comply with any instruction may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.
- 19. BWFC reserves absolutely the right to eject from the Ground any person failing to comply with any of the Ground Regulations or whose presence within the Ground is, or could, reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. This could lead to further action including, but not limited to, a ban from the Ground or proceedings being taken.
- 20. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of the ground Regulations.


