MATCH PREVIEW – Michael Duffy

Treaty United have been the surprise packages of the First Division this season. With the team only assembled a couple of weeks before the season began many people expected them to struggle near the foot of the table.

It was evident on the opening day of the season at the Carlisle Grounds that Tommy Barrett had assembled a decent and competitive squad. The Limerick side earned a deserved 0-0 draw against Wanderers that day.

Despite Wanderers being on top in the return game at the Markets Field in May, Treaty scored twice in the closing stages to run out 2-0 winners.

Treaty United were unbeaten in their opening six league games this season with two wins and four draws. Up to last week's home defeat to Cabinteely FC, Treaty United were on a good run with just one league defeat in their previous eight league games with six wins, one draw and one defeat in that run.

Jack Lynch is the top league scorer for Treaty United this season having netted five league goals followed by Kieran Hanlon (4) and Sean McSweeney (4). Treaty United have the worst disciplinary record in the First division having amassed five red cards and 39 yellow cards in their 18 league games to date. Clyde O'Connell misses out on tonight's game through suspension having been sent off in last weeks home defeat to Cabinteely.

Bray Wanderers are on a seven-match unbeaten league run and following last week's 3-1 home win over Wexford FC have moved up to fourth place in the First Division, their highest league position of the season.

A win for Bray Wanderers tonight against Treaty United will see Wanderers leapfrog the Limerick side on goal difference. Wanderers could end up in second place in the table tonight if they win and Galway United lose at home to Shelbourne.



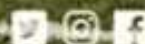

Kian played with Bohemians' under U17s and U19s teams in 2017. He moved to Shamrock Rovers in 2018 and made his senior debut for them in a Leinster Senior Cup tie against St Mochtas. Kian made 6 appearances for Shamrock Rovers II in the First division in 2020.

Kian earned six caps at under 17 level for Ireland in October 2017 and March 2018. He earned one cap at under 18 level in a 3-1 friendly defeat to England in November 2018.

Kian joined Bray Wanderers in January 2020. He is still awaiting his first team debut but has played for the under 19s this season as an over age player.



QUIGLEY'S WORLD OF FOOTBALL

" 'So You Want To Be A Rock 'n' Roll Star' " By Brian Quigley

Whenever I see Gareth Ainsworth, I think of The Byrds song "So You Want To Be A Rock 'n' Roll Star". With his flowing locks and biker jacket, Ainsworth looks like a rock star, or an actor from the set of Easy Rider, the Peter Fonda and Dennis Hopper classic that introduced Jack Nicholson to the film world [the aforementioned Byrds contributed a lot of music to the soundtrack].

Being a rock star isn't something he just hankers after though – he has had a parallel career to his soccer one, being in bands such as Dog Chewed The Handle, The Cold Blooded Hearts and Road To Eden over the years. Yep, Ainsworth is a real-deal 'character'.

Football needs characters, just like any sport does. Soccer has given us many great ones in the past and for me Ainsworth continues the tradition. Yes, a sport is primarily about the talents and skills of the participants, but we are human and we respond positively to entertaining and interesting characters and when someone combines talent and character they make for good box office.

He is currently second on the list of longest-serving managers in England's top four divisions; having been in charge of Wycombe Wanderers for nine seasons, only Simon Weaver at Horwogate Town has been at the helm of a professional club longer.

Ainsworth had a journeyman's playing career. He started out at Blackburn Rovers in 1989 but never made the first team. He then played for an array of teams including Northwich Victoria, Cambridge United, Preston North End, Lincoln City, Port Vale, Wimbledon, Walsall, Cardiff City, Queens Park Rangers and Wycombe Wanderers. Officially he stopped playing in 2013, aged 40, but he retained his

playing registration for several seasons after that, never picking himself.

Ainsworth's musical talents first became public knowledge when he was at Wimbledon [during their Premier League days; the club have now morphed into the MK Dons while phoenix club AFC Wimbledon have climbed the pyramid to the same level as the Dons], where he was in a band called APA with teammates Chris Perry and Trond Andersen. Dog Chewed The Handle – who were named after a Terrorvision song – had an opportunity to support Bad Manners on tour but had to turn it down due to Ainsworth's soccer commitments; that was a pity because Ainsworth could have had some great soccer chats with Bad Manners' lead singer Doug 'Buster Bloodvessel' Trendle, a soccer fan himself and former jersey sponsor of Margate FC.

Ainsworth and Wycombe Wanderers played last season at the club's highest-ever level, in the Championship, mixing it up with a whole division of clubs who have played in the top-flight at one time or another. Although Wycombe were out of their depth, Ainsworth kept team morale high and a late run of positive results saw them climb off the bottom and only finish a point off survival at the death. Derby County, managed by Wayne Rooney, survived at Wycombe's expense.

Final word tonight is to wish Dave Roberts, author of the football books '32 Programmes', 'Home and Away', 'The Long, Long Road To Wembley' and 'The Bromley Boys' [which has been turned into a film] a full recovery having being diagnosed recently with a serious illness. Positives vibes from Bray to you Dave.

“Hold me back and let me at him!”

Mícheál Ó hUanacháin reflects on the strangest Olympic Games of modern times

So it's official: Ireland is a nation of scrappers. In the Olympic Games since 1924, Irish boxers have continued to win more medals than Irish Olympians in all other sports combined.

From John McNally in 1952 to Kellie Harrington last Sunday, the so-called "manly art" produced eighteen of our 35 sporting medals ever, putting Ireland in 21st place in the all-time Olympic boxing table, behind Canada and ahead of China. The country's athletes have only won 17 other sports medals in that time.

Boxing has also produced one of our only two athletes to have won medals at two separate Olympics: Paddy Barnes's Bronze medals at Light-flyweight from Beijing 2008 and London 2012 were unique in Irish sporting history until Paul O'Donovan (with a new partner, Fintan McCarthy) picked up a Gold in the lightweight double sculls in Tokyo to go with the Silver he won in Rio with his brother Gary.

The previous Tokyo Olympics, in 1964, was one of three Games at which the *only* medals Ireland won were in boxing; the others in that category were 1992 (Barcelona) and Beijing.

During that period, Cuban boxers and those from the United States dominated that sport at the Games, with the old Soviet Union trying to keep up.

The Cubans made something of a comeback this year, winning four of the thirteen boxing Golds available.

Tokyo's second hosting of the Games will, however, be remembered by the world as the one when the Olympic movement and the Japanese government defied public opinion and health advice in persisting with a delayed 32nd Games despite a worldwide pandemic which in some parts of the globe was apparently out of control.

In the year since the Games were postponed from their rightful dates in 2020, week after week saw public outcry and demonstrations in Japan against the holding of the Games at all.

Experts say the government's decision to plough ahead with the Olympics while also telling people to stay home and obey social distancing has shattered the willingness of Japanese people to abide by the public health rules. Tokyo is currently enduring its fourth State of Emergency since Covid-19 first surfaced, and enthusiasm for the Games had dropped to unfathomed depths, a long way from the hype of the heady days eight years ago when the IOC decided that 2020 would be held in Tokyo.

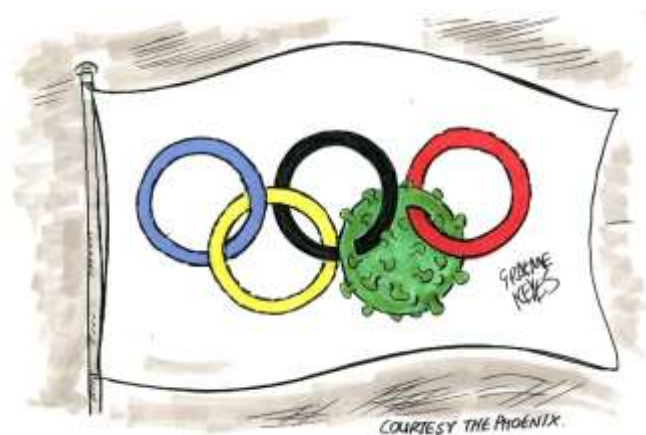
Back then, the Japanese government estimated that it would cost the city some €6 billion to host the Games. By 2019, that had almost doubled to €11 billion, and when the decision was made to

postpone them for a year (with the government among the loudest supporters of that, rather than cancellation), it almost instantly added another €2 bn to the budget.

Official auditors, however, have said total spending already exceeds €17bn, and independent media in Tokyo have estimated the final bill will be a whopping €24 billion. And the Games behind closed doors, as they were in the end, deprived the city of the only serious income they were expecting after their heroic decision to postpone.

In the months leading up to the Games, as many as half the population still wanted them cancelled. Last June, as few as 50% of those polled believed they would actually take place. At least 13,500 of the more than 40,000 "city volunteers" who had been enrolled to assist in running the Olympics withdrew before the opening ceremony.

Japanese health experts said last May the daily infection rate in Tokyo should be below 100 in order to hold the Games safely. Case numbers did fall from mid-May, although they never got down to 100 a day. And as the Games got under way last month, less than 30% of the Japanese population was fully vaccinated, and the number of new cases daily in the capital was hovering around 1500. Within days that had risen again to 4,000, and eventually reached 5,000, the highest figure ever.



That's not counting the 430 cases recorded among those involved with the Games, 236 contract workers, 109 Games participants and 29 athletes.

There were many surprises in the competitions, but perhaps our immediate interest apart from the Irish athletes' commendable performances is in the football tournament.



Australia, beaten by the Ireland Under-21s in Wales during their pre-Olympic preparations, played their Group matches in the north of Japan, in Sapporo and later a little further south in Rifu. They defeated Argentina 2–0 and nearly held on for a draw to Spain, losing to an 81st minute goal. The Olyroos needed at least a draw against Egypt to progress, but they lost 2–0, finishing bottom of their group.

The Men's Final was contested between Brazil and Spain last Saturday in Yokohama, the former needing Extra Time to claim the Gold by two goals to one.

The "Matildas", as they call the Australian women's team, did a lot better, a 2-1 victory over the Kiwis in Tokyo to start, followed by a 4-2 loss to Sweden, and then the draw they needed to progress as one of the best third-placed teams, scoreless against the mighty USA. An Extra Time 4-3 Quarter-Final win against the British team must have been satisfactory, but they lost in the Semi-Final, again beaten by Sweden, and in the Bronze medal play-off, when the USA took their revenge.

It must have been galling for the USA women's team, touted for years as the best in the world, to watch the much-mocked Canadians collect their Gold medals after winning the penalty shoot-out at the end of their 1-1 Final draw with Sweden.

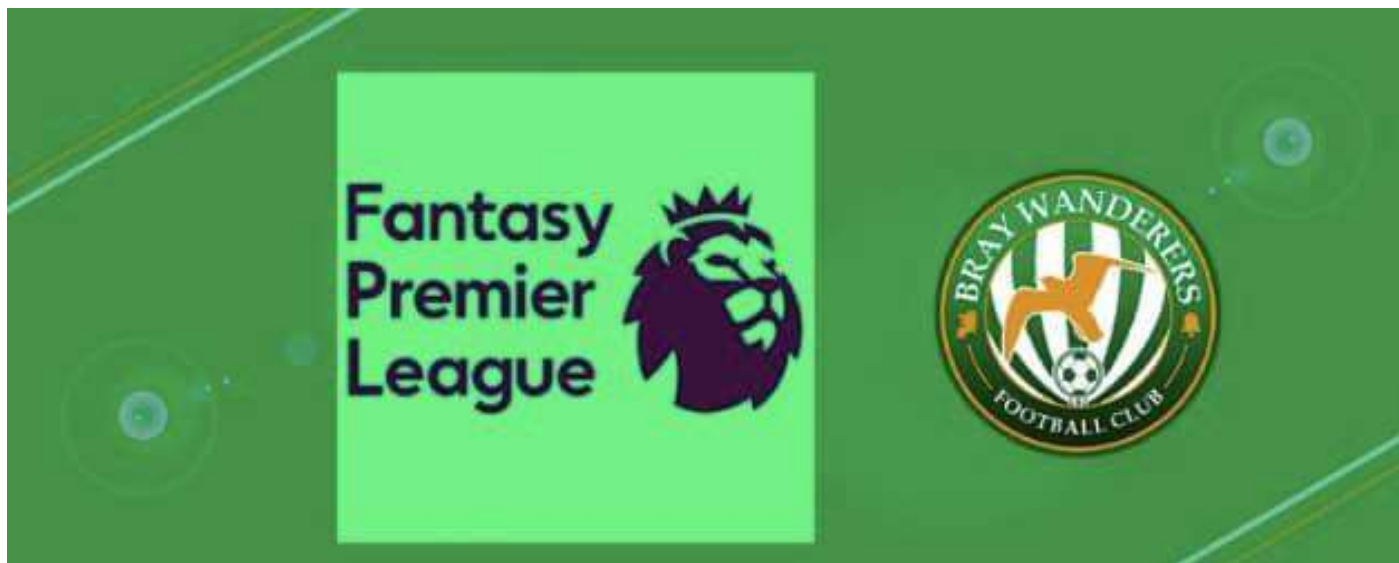

THE CARLISLE GROUNDS GROUND REGULATIONS

Entry to the ground is subject to acceptance by the visitor of these Ground Regulations. Entry to the ground constitutes acceptance of the Ground Regulations, and this shall apply in respect of all events within the Ground.

"Ground" means the Carlisle Grounds and all locations owned, occupied or utilised by Bray Wanderers Football Club.

"Events" means any event taking place at the Carlisle Grounds. "BWFC" means Bray Wanderers Football Club.

1. Permission to enter the or to remain within the Ground (notwithstanding possession of any ticket) is at the absolute discretion of BWFC, any member of Garda Síochána or authorised steward. On no account will admission to any Event be granted to any person not in possession of a valid ticket. On no account will admission to a Football match be granted to a person who is the subject of a current banning order.
2. BWFC excludes to the maximum extent permitted by law any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property in or around the Ground.
3. No guarantees can be given to BWFC that an Event will take place at a particular time or on a particular date and BWFC reserves the right to reschedule the Event without notice and without any liability whatsoever.
4. In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Event, refunds (If any) should be claimed in accordance with the relevant event organiser's ticket terms and conditions. BWFC will have no other liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited) loss of enjoyment or travel costs.
5. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge BWFC's right to search any person whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search
6. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground – knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground.
7. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
1. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment, or any such banners or flags, is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
8. Conviction of any of the following may result in a banning order being made –
 - 8.1 The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse
 - 8.2 The chanting of anything of an indecent or racist nature.
 - 8.3 The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse.
 - 8.4 Attempting to enter the Ground or being inside the ground whilst drunk.
 - 8.5 Being in possession of any intoxicating liquor or can or other portable container and which could cause damage or personal injury, when entering the ground or in public area of the Ground from which the event can be directly viewed.
9. All persons entering the Ground may only occupy the seat/area allocated to them by their ticket and must not move from any one part of the ground to another without the express permission or instruction of any steward, officer of BWFC and/or any member of An Garda Síochána.
10. Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.
11. The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and like places is strictly forbidden. Nobody entering the Ground shall be permitted to climb any structures within the Ground.
12. Smoking in No-Smoking Areas is strictly forbidden.
13. Mobile telephones and other communications devices are permitted within the Ground provided that they are used for personal and private use only.
14. Any individual who has entered any part of the Ground designated for the use of any group of supporters to which they do not belong may be ejected from the Ground either for the purpose of their own safety or for any other reason.
15. No person (other than a person who holds an appropriate licence) may bring into the Ground or use within the Ground any equipment which, is capable of recording or transmitting (by digital or other means) any audio, visual or audio-visual material or any information or data in relation to the Event or Ground. Copyright in any unauthorised recording or transmission is assigned to BWFC.
16. No goods (including literature) of any nature may be offered either free or for sale by any person within the Ground without the express written permission of BWFC.
17. Tickets are not transferable and may not be offered for sale without the prior written permission of BWFC. Any tickets offered for sale may be confiscated by any steward or officer of BWFC or any member of An Garda Síochána.
18. At all times while present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward and/or member of An Garda Síochána. Failure to comply with any instruction may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.
19. BWFC reserves absolutely the right to eject from the Ground any person failing to comply with any of the Ground Regulations or whose presence within the Ground is, or could, reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. This could lead to further action including, but not limited to, a ban from the Ground or proceedings being taken.
20. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of the ground Regulations.
