




MATCH PREVIEW - Michael Duffy

Bray Wanderers have failed to beat Athlone Town in the two meetings this season. Athlone came from a goal down to win 2-1 at the Carlisle Grounds in April. Dylan Barnett put Wanderers ahead on seven minutes before Kurtis Byrne scored twice for Athlone on 11 and 15 minutes. Wanderers ended the game with ten men when Ryan Graydon was dismissed three minutes from time.

In the return game at the Athlone Town stadium in June the sides played out a scoreless draw in a game in which Graydon was sent off on 34 minutes.

Athlone Town started the season well and were top of the table when they visited the Carlisle Grounds last April. They were unbeaten in their opening five league games with four wins and a draw. A surprise 2-1 home defeat to Cabinteely in game six saw the Midlander's go on a three-game losing run.

That losing run was ended with a 2-1 home win over Cobh Ramblers in May, but three successive league defeats followed. Athlone won one, drew two and lost six in a nine-game run from the end of April to early July.

Following a 6-0 away defeat to UCD in the Belfield Bowl last month the club appointed former Ireland under 19 manager Paul Doolin as their new manager. The side defeated Galway United 1-0 at home in Doolin's first game in charge but were defeated 3-1 away to Cork City last week.

Athlone Town's away record this season shows three wins, three draws and five defeats. Curtis Byrne and ex-Wanderer Shane Barnes are the leading league goal scorers for Athlone this season on five goals apiece. Another ex-Wanderers Adam Wixted has three goals alongside James Doona and Stephen Meaney.

Bray Wanderers are unbeaten in their last five home games with four wins and one draw since losing at home to Shelbourne in June. Gary Shaw's hat trick last week against UCD was the 19th hat trick scored by a Bray Wanderers player since the club entered the League of Ireland in 1985. It was also the second time that a Bray Wanderers player has scored a hat trick and ended up on the losing side. Ryan Brennan scored three times away to UCD in the Belfield Bowl in an FAI cup tie in May 2016 in a game which also ended 4-3 to the students.

"Exit Exeter"

Getting relegated from the English Football League to the National League is an occupational hazard for teams in the lower divisions. For some it can be the beginning of the end, for others simply the beginning of the next chapter, a rebuilding process. Carlisle United went out of the League and returned, as did Leyton Orient and Lincoln City. Wrexham, on the other hand, have been stuck in the fifth tier National League since 2008.

For me though, the fall and rise of Exeter City was the best comeback of all, using their National League [then the Football Conference] years between 2003 and 2008 as a chance to enter fan ownership [the Exeter City Supporters Trust] so that they came back stronger. They did come back stronger, and haven't looked back since.

Exeter City are a club with an interesting nickname. To trace the origins of 'The Grecians' tag you have to go back to the club's formation in 1901 from the amalgamation of Exeter United and St Sidwells United. The St Sidwells parish is located beyond the city walls, and so has parallels with Homer's Iliad, where Greek forces laid siege to the walls of Troy. Bet you never knew soccer could be so interesting!

Being based in Devon means that City contest several West Country derbies, depending on which other sides out of Yeovil Town, Plymouth Argyle, Torquay United, Bristol City and Bristol Rovers are in their league in any given year, which means just Joey Barton's Bristol Rovers for the 2021-22 League Two campaign [the fans will tell you that Plymouth are their biggest rivals].

Exeter have never ventured into the top two tiers, a bit like my own club Rochdale. Their return to

the EFL in 2008 was followed by a climb into League One for three seasons; since 2012 they have been members of League Two, so 2021-22 will celebrate a decade of membership of the fourth tier.


Exeter have some famous fans. Chris Martin of Coldplay is a fan, as are Joss Stone, Noel Edmonds and Adrian Edmondson. David Pleat – who went on to manage Luton Town and Tottenham Hotspur – played for the club in the 1960's.

Two names I will always associate with 'The Grecians' are Paul Tisdale, their long-serving manager [he was in charge between 2006 and 2018, an incredible amount of time in the modern professional game; for 19 days in 2018 he was English soccer's longest-serving manager] and Tony Kellow, goal-scorer extraordinaire during three spells at the club between 1976 and 1988 [129 goals in 332 games]. Kellow was in the side for arguably their finest moment historically – a run to the 1980-81 FA Cup quarter-finals, where they lost out to eventual winners Tottenham Hotspur after 'giant-killing' Newcastle United and Leicester City along the way.

A final word on The Grecians, and it's not a footballing one. I can't help but associate the nickname with the Grecian 2000 men's hair colouring preparation. Adds for this product were always on television in my youth; the product made news recently when the manufactures were forced to replace the lead acetate with bismuth citrate for the progressive colourant.

Enjoy the game tonight. As our season enters the home stretch we remain firmly behind the team as they attempt to finish in a play-off position

Happy Birthday FAI

Mícheál Ó hUanacháin looks back at the turbulent times when the FAI was founded one hundred years ago

This summer, the football community marks the centenary of the establishment of a separate governing body in Dublin, challenging the authority of "The Irish Football Association, Ltd" (the "Limited" was very important to the Belfast administrators, and was rarely omitted from its official pronouncements). 10 September 2021 is the 100th anniversary of the first competitive games under the new regime.

The decision to leave the IFA, coming as it did while the guerrilla warfare between the IRA and the British forces was still in progress with no end in sight, was clearly not a consequence of the Treaty, yet to be negotiated, nor as we will see a response to partition, which was already in train.

By far the single most important reason for the Southern impulse to separate from Belfast was to be found within football itself.

From the foundation of the Irish Football Association in 1892, the focus of the game's administrators on the island was inward, on Belfast and the surrounding area. That attitude was apparently unaffected by the formation of the Leinster Football Association, its first divisional body, twelve years later, and still less notice was taken of the establishment of the Munster FA in 1901.

In fact, the Belfast body's late and derisory response to the latter's appeal for funds to help them get on their feet was just another example of the parent body's lack of interest in anything outside the North-East. Of course, Killarney was a jewel when it came to hosting the International Football Association Board meeting in February 1905, but that was different, wasn't it?

The years immediately after the Great War saw a series of increasingly high-profile snubs to the southern clubs, the LFA and the footballing public. The LFA at its annual meeting in the summer of 1918 announced a financial loss, and

only 77 clubs affiliated. By contrast, the IFA had ring-fenced its pre-war kitty of more than £2,000 and the Irish League was also in the black. The Belfast body told the LFA to get its activities back on a sound footing, but when Leinster asked for £300 for that purpose, the IFA gave them £50.

No international match was played in Dublin from 1918 to 1920: all home matches were played in Belfast. That decision, though perhaps unsurprising, was hardly helpful to relations within the sport.

With the Irish League suspended during the War, Shelbourne, Bohemians and Belfast Celtic declined to join a revived League for 1918/19, and the project collapsed.

Shelbourne's 1919 Irish Cup Semi-Final in Belfast was decided in favour of Linfield after extra time: the practice had been that a drawn game would see a replay set for Dublin. The Reds won the following year's trophy by default when both participants in the other Semi-Final were expelled!

In January 1921 Belfast Celtic, Bohemians and Shelbourne were excluded from the City Cup. The same month, St James Gate withdrew from the Intermediate Cup when their Semi-Final match was moved to Belfast.

The following month, IFA officials made a big todo about removing what were described as "Sinn Fein flags" before an amateur international when Ireland beat France 2-1 at Parc des Princes on 8 February.

The final straw was yet another drama featuring Shelbourne, who had again reached the Semi-Final of the Irish Cup, drawing with Glenavon in Belfast in March 1921. There would be a replay this time – but the Dublin club was aghast when without consultation the IFA agreed to facilitate

the Belfast club by not forcing them to travel to Dublin for that match.

There was some basis for security concerns, all right, but conditions in Belfast itself were no less unsettled than those in Dublin, and Shelbourne's decision not to travel was as inevitable as the rift that was now clearly visible between the IFA and the Leinster body.

In April 1921 the Leinster association canvassed opinion among its affiliated clubs on the possibility of severing the link with Belfast, and on 1 June 1921 in the Molesworth Hall in Dublin the LFA's annual meeting 'almost unanimously' voted to end its affiliation with the IFA.


The administrators set about organising a League and Cup for 1921/22 even before they achieved the formal establishment of the Football Association of Ireland, whose draft rules were ratified at another Molesworth Hall meeting on 3 September, just a week before the new season opened. In July, the 28 clubs of the Falls & District League in Belfast had applied to affiliate to the new body, and they were eventually accepted.

On the political front, partition was already in law under the UK's 1920 Government of Ireland Act.

The post-war General Election in December 1918 had seen the Irish Parliamentary Party almost completely wiped out by Sinn Féin candidates, and when fresh elections were held on 24 May 1921 for parliaments north and south, the southern ones were 'virtual' as all the candidates were unopposed.

King George V would formally open the new Northern Ireland parliament in Belfast City Hall on 22 June 1921 – but for many nationalists (and most if not all republicans) partition was by no means a done deal: the War of Independence was far from over and the outcome still in the balance. There was even a provision in the Government of Ireland Act for the two parliaments to unite if they so choose.

That Lloyd George and De Valera agreed a truce on 9 July 1921, to come into effect on the 11th – inside a month since the King's cogent speech to the Northern parliament – had no bearing on the decision of the Leinster football community that they had had enough of Belfast's bullying: that die was already cast.

There is little or no surviving evidence that the LFA was in effect jumping the gun on partition, and the new FAI's acceptance of the FaIIs league as an affiliate suggests rather that they sought to replace the IFA as a body for the whole island. That view would be underpinned later when the Derry League tried to affiliate with the Dublin body, and it would also be the basis of their initial approach to FIFA.





THE CARLISLE GROUNDS GROUND REGULATIONS

Entry to the ground is subject to acceptance by the visitor of these Ground Regulations. Entry to the ground constitutes acceptance of the Ground Regulations, and this shall apply in respect of all events within the Ground.

"Ground" means the Carlisle Grounds and all locations owned, occupied or utilised by Bray Wanderers Football Club.

"Events" means any event taking place at the Carlisle Grounds. "BWFC" means Bray Wanderers Football Club.

- 1. Permission to enter the or to remain within the Ground (not withstanding possession of any ticket) is at the absolute discretion of BWFC, any member of Garda Siochana or authorised steward. On no account will admission to any Event be granted to any person not in possession of a valid ticket. On no account will admission to a Football match be granted to a person who is the subject of a current banning order.
- BWFC excludes to the maximum extent permitted by law any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property in or around the Ground.
- 3. No guarantees can be given to BWFC that an Event will take place at a particular time or on a particular date and BWFC reserves the right to reschedule the Event without notice and without any liability whatsoever.
- 4. In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Event, refunds (If any) should be claimed in accordance with the relevant event organiser's ticket terms and conditions. BWFC will have no other liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited) loss of enjoyment or travel costs.
- 5. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge BWFC's right to search any person whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search
- 6. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground
- 7. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
- Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment, or any such banners or flags, is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
- 8 Conviction of any of the following may result in a banning order being made -
- 8.1 The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse
- 8.2 The chanting of anything of an indecent or racialist nature.
- 8.3 The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse.
- 8.4 Attempting to enter the Ground or being inside the ground whilst drunk.
- 8.5 Being in possession of any intoxicating liquor or can or other portable container and which could cause damage or personal injury, when entering the ground or in public area of the Ground from which the event can be directly viewed.
- 9. All persons entering the Ground may only occupy the seat/area allocated to them by their ticket and must not move from any one part of the ground to another without the express permission or instruction of any steward, officer of BWFC and/or any member of An Garda Siochana.
- 10. Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.
- 11. The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and like places is strictly forbidden. Nobody entering the Ground shall be permitted to climb any structures within the Ground.
- 12. Smoking in No-Smoking Areas is strictly forbidden.
- 13. Mobile telephones and other communications devices are permitted within the Ground provided that they are used for personal and private use only.
- 14. Any individual who has entered any part of the Ground designated for the use of any group of supporters to which they do not belong may be ejected from the Ground either for the purpose of their own safety or for any other reason.
- 15. No person (other than a person who holds an appropriate licence) may bring into the Ground or use within the Ground any equipment which, is capable of recording or transmitting (by digital or other means) any audio, visual or audio-visual material or any information or data in relation to the Event or Ground. Copyright in any unauthorised recording or transmission is assigned to BWFC.
- 16. No goods (including literature) of any nature may be offered either free or for sale by any person within the Ground without the express written permission of BWFC.
- 17. Tickets are not transferable and may not be offered for sale without the prior written permission of BWFC. Any tickets offered for sale may be confiscated by any steward or officer of BWFC or any member of An Garda Siochana.
- 18. At all times while present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward and/or member of An Garda Siochana. Failure to comply with any instruction may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.
- 19. BWFC reserves absolutely the right to eject from the Ground any person failing to comply with any of the Ground Regulations or whose presence within the Ground is, or could, reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. This could lead to further action including, but not limited to, a ban from the Ground or proceedings being taken.
- 20. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of the ground Regulations.


