MATCH PREVIEW – Michael Duffy

Bray Wanderers need two points from their final three league games to secure a promotion play off position. One point would realistically be enough as Wanderers are five points clear of sixth place Athlone Town who have just two games remaining. Wanderers also have a 19-goal advantage over the Midlanders

Tonight's meeting of Bray Wanderers and Cabinteely FC is only the ninth meeting of the sides in senior competitions.

Bray Wanderers won the first meeting on a 3-0 score line in Stradbrook on the opening day of the 2019 season. Cabinteely then won three and drew one of the next four games against Bray Wanderers.

Bray have won the last three league meetings on a 3-0 score line including both of this season's league meetings. Dylan Barnett, Richie O'Farrell and Gary Shaw scored the goals at the Carlisle Grounds in the meeting in May. In July, Joe Doyle, Sam Verdon and Brandon Kavanagh scored the Bray goals in Stradbrook in July.

Cabinteely did beat Bray 2-1 at the Carlisle Grounds in a Leinster senior cup tie in 2019 but this was a Cabinteely home game played in the Carlisle Grounds.

Cabinteely FC have never kept a clean sheet against Bray Wanderers in the eight previous meetings.

Bray Wanderers have won one, drawn one and lost two of their last four league games.

Cabinteely are on a poor run at the moment having lost their last five league games and have picked up just one

point from their last seven league games. They have won one, drawn one and lost twelve of their last fourteen league games.

Keith Dalton misses out on the game for Cabinteely FC with an additional one match suspension for a recent red card. Daniel Jones returns to the Bray squad having missed the home draw with Cork City a fortnight ago though suspension.

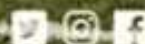

QUIGLEY'S WORLD OF FOOTBALL

Dempsey & Makepeace

Dempsey & Makepeace might have more resonance with you as a television show than a pair of footballers. For those of you not in the know, it starred Michael Brandon as Dempsey and Glynis Barber as Makepeace. He was a street-wise, working-class NY cop on secondment to an elite, armed unit of the London Metropolitan Police; she was his partner while he was on secondment and came from an aristocratic English background.

I guess the premise behind the show was that the pairing were chalk and cheese, two very different people who would struggle to get on and form a partnership. But form an excellent partnership they did, and life went on to imitate art as Brandon and Barber married in real life; more than 30 years later they are still together.

The footballing Dempsey and Makepeace I've paired together were never a pairing in real life. I'm sure if you search hard enough you could find two players with these surnames that played together, but I've chosen to go for two players whose lives and careers I know a bit about and am impressed by, even if they were a century apart.

Dempsey first. Clint Dempsey to be precise, he of New England Revolution, Fulham, Tottenham Hotspur and Seattle Sounders. And, of course, the USA national team, who he toggled out for 141 times, netting 57 goals. A forward of a very decent standard, he was the first US player to bag a hat-trick in the Premier League, and he scored in each of the three FIFA World Cups that he appeared in [he also appeared in four CONCACAF Gold Cups, winning three of them].

Dempsey was a creative player who was versatile enough to be able to play in midfield as well as attack. Some of you might remember the chip from the edge of the box he scored for Fulham against Juventus in the 2010 Europa League round of 16. A classy and classic goal for sure.

Off the field, Dempsey has always been an interesting guy. A fatal illness to his sister in his teenage years and a strong Catholic faith spurred him on and drove his ambition to escape life in the trailer park he was brought up in through soccer. A talent for hip hop music rounds out a unique character.

Makepeace next. Meet Joseph William Henry 'Harry' Makepeace, of Everton and England in soccer and Lancashire and England in cricket. He also managed to find time to serve in World War One as a flight sergeant in the Royal Air Force.

I first came across Harry Makepeace when reading about the twelve English 'Double Internationals', men who had represented England at both soccer and cricket. He played as a wing half for Everton between 1902 and 1919, interrupted of course by The Great War. He clocked up 336 appearances and was an FA Cup winner in 1906. His four England caps came between 1906 and 1912.

Makepeace's cricket career ran simultaneously with his soccer career for many years, but ultimately outlasted it. He played first-class cricket for Lancashire between 1906 and 1930, and was on the England side for the 1920-21 Ashes series against Australia.

Enjoy the game tonight.

Player Profile Darren Craven

Age: 26

Darren played with Malahide United from 2014 to this year before joining Bray Wanderers in January 2021.

He captained Malahide United to the Leinster Senior title in 2020. He was Malahide's player of the year in 2019 and top scorer with 16 goals.

He also captained Malahide when they won the Charlie Cahill Cup in March 2019 after they defeated Crumlin United in the final 5-4 on penalties after the sides drew 1-1 after extra time. Darren converted Malahide's first penalty in the shootout. They reached the FAI intermediate cup semi-final in 2019 where they lost 1-0 to St. Mochtas.

This season in Darren's first season in the League of Ireland and he has scored three league goals this season including a goal of the season contender against Wexford FC in August when he chipped the Wexford keeper from the side line.

TV or not TV

Mícheál Ó hUanacháin looks at a glut of TV for ourselves which conceals a lack of TV for the general public

It was very difficult to track down the results of the Womens Senior Cup Semi-Finals last Saturday.

Well, more precisely, only one of the games was noted properly on extratime.ie, there wasn't a word on sseairtricityleague.ie (which hasn't made any provision for any of the official women's leagues to date, senior or under-age) and as for RTÉ, they might not even have happened. Admittedly, the men's senior international, unfortunately on the same day, took pride of place – but not even a mention?

Hours after Extra Time and the final whistle, the eponymous website still had Peamount and the Youths at nil-all in the first half.

Well, at least it was on TV, says you, so the real fans could have watched it. Indeed, it was – on LOI TV.

We have the pandemic to thank for the ready availability, for the first time, of live video of the domestic game on a routine basis. WatchLOI and LOITV were a revelation, an eye-opener to what could be achieved for (relatively) very little expense. Their quality was variable, as was the quality of the commentaries – but they were there, week in week out.

The higher cost of the Premier version, WatchLOI, was probably a factor in the midseason change to LOITV all round, but it is also a concern: will the service be abandoned completely when ground attendances are back to 100% long-term?

But these are matters for the hardened fans, the ones who would watch from Hell if the devil had a URL for the livestream. The availability of domestic soccer to the general public is a different, ahem, ballgame.

The women's game got a boost last month when TG4 announced it was going to televise four of the remaining WNL matches, and it had long been the plan that the Women's Cup Final would be on RTÉ2. Why such a decision should be taken by TG4 so late in the season is a mystery.

The venture, welcome though it be, pales into insignificance when one remembers that back in early July, the same station announced its live coverage of the 2021 All-Ireland Ladies Football Championships:

all 63 games of it. Admittedly, only 13 of those were to be on air, with the rest on the Ladies Gaelic Football Association's equivalent of WatchLOI. But let it pass.

TG4's WNL coverage duly started with Shelbourne hosting DLR Waves on 02 October, but the other three dates are still unannounced. Mind you, as we speak there are only five weekends left in the WNL season, so choices are narrowing.

Choices are also narrowing for the remaining promised live Premier Division games on RTÉ. It doesn't make the national broadcaster's job easier when the FAI has to defer matches because of international call-ups.

But that doesn't absolve RTÉ of its responsibility to the domestic game. It's not at all clear that Montrose recognises that as a part of its public service remit, and it's very clear that the FAI has failed to press that point for years.

RTÉ Group Head of Sport Declan McBennett did the organisation scant favour with his contribution to the "LOI Central" podcast last month, letting long-time fan and activist Johnny Ward rattle him so much that he effectively lost any standing in the debate.

The matter at issue appears to have been the question of whether he (McBennett) bore personal responsibility

for the failure to cover the matches of League clubs in European competition (only one out of twenty games shown).

McBennett has long suffered from a popular perception that he is a GAA-man, and stoutly defends his capability of striking an appropriate balance between the competing demands of the many and varied sports the station covers.

This is, in essence, the fan as commentator problem writ large. It is one the clubs have noticed on the narrowcasting this season, when commentators came from the ranks of their own fans, and not merely misidentified opposing players but in some instances practically ignored the visiting team's efforts throughout the ninety minutes.

It's a big step up from cheering the team on to describing their efforts for an absent audience, and one some were unable to take. As Michael Rand of the Minneapolis *StarTribune* put it,

One of the most fundamental rules of the press box is that there is no cheering. ... We are not there rooting for either team. We are there to document what is happening and distill it for an audience.

There's a necessary detachment in the role of commentator, and this is matched in the step from

being an expert in one sport to taking responsibility for many: it may at times even require taking a decision which may be seen as detrimental to one's one favourite sport.

Mr McBennett failed to prove his detachment on LOI Central – and when the next planned live LOI coverage announcement followed shortly after, it had the unfortunate effect of looking like an attempt to counter the bad impression.

Doubly unfortunate, in that the planning of the coverage seemed somewhat less than optimal: one poster on foot.ie put his reaction like this

They want it to fail to prove themselves right and say to us "We put on a few games (randomly scattered through the year with 0 promotion or logic behind fixtures chosen) and the interest just isn't there".

While the point about promotion may have some merit, I can assure the poster that RTÉ routinely puts considerable thought into its choice of programming. If the outcome in the meantime becomes a less interesting fixture in terms of the progress of the League, that's not RTÉ's fault. If the match in question turns out to be one of the worst played this season, that also is not the broadcaster's fault.

On this day....15 October

Bray Wanderers have played seven times on this date in their League of Ireland history with mixed results having won two, drawn three and lost twice on this date before.

1989 Bray Wanderers were defeated 1-0 away to Sligo Rovers in a First division encounter at the Showgrounds.

1995 Bray drew 0-0 at home to Cobh Ramblers in a First division game.

1996 Wanderers were defeated 2-0 away to St. Patrick's Athletic in a Leinster senior cup game in Richmond Park.

2003 In the first season of summer soccer Bray Wanderers drew 3-3 away to Galway United to maintain third place in the First division. Wanderers came from two down at half time and 3-1 down after 52 minutes to salvage a point with late goals from John Flood (85 minutes) and Colm Tresson (90+2) to maintain third place. Eamon Zayed had pulled a goal back for B ray five minutes into the second half.

2004 Wanderers defeated Athlone Town 5-3 in a First division encounter at the Carlisle Grounds. Eamon Zayed became the first player to score four times in a competitive game for Bray Wanderers at League of Ireland level. The other goal Bray goal was an own goal.

2007 Wanderers drew 1-1 at home to Derry City in a Premier division game at the Carlisle Grounds. Paul Dunphy scored two minutes into added time at the end of the game to rescue appoint for Wanderers. Earlier, Gareth McGlynn had put Derry ahead on 26 minutes.

1. Permission to enter the or to remain within the Ground (notwithstanding possession of any ticket) is at the absolute discretion of BWFC, any member of Garda Síochána or authorised steward. On no account will admission to any Event be granted to any person not in possession of a valid ticket. On no account will admission to a Football match be granted to a person who is the subject of a current banning order.
2. BWFC excludes to the maximum extent permitted by law any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property in or around the Ground.
3. No guarantees can be given to BWFC that an Event will take place at a particular time or on a particular date and BWFC reserves the right to reschedule the Event without notice and without any liability whatsoever.
4. In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Event, refunds (if any) should be claimed in accordance with the relevant event organiser's ticket terms and conditions. BWFC will have no other liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited to) loss of enjoyment or travel costs.
5. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge BWFC's right to search any person whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search
6. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground – knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground.
7. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
1. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment, or any such banners or flags, is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.

9. All persons entering the Ground may only occupy the seat/area allocated to them by their ticket and must not move from any one part of the ground to another without the express permission or instruction of any steward, officer of BWFC and/or any member of An Garda Síochána.
10. Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.
11. The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and like places is strictly forbidden. Nobody entering the Ground shall be permitted to climb any structures within the Ground.
12. Smoking in No-Smoking Areas is strictly forbidden.

Copyright in any unauthorised recording or transmission is assigned to BWFC.
16. No goods (including literature) of any nature may be offered either free or for sale by any person within the Ground without the express written permission of BWFC.
17. Tickets are not transferable and may not be offered for sale without the prior written permission of BWFC. Any tickets offered for sale may be confiscated by any steward or officer of BWFC or any member of An Garda Síochána.
18. At all times while present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward and/or member of An Garda Síochána. Failure to comply with any instruction may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.
19. BWFC reserves absolutely the right to eject from the Ground any person failing to comply with any of the Ground Regulations or whose presence within the Ground is, or could, reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. This could lead to further action including, but not limited to, a ban from the Ground or proceedings being taken.
20. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of the ground Regulations.
