



MATCH PREVIEW - Michael Duffy

Cork City are unbeaten in their last eight games against Bray Wanderers. Wanderers had lost six successive games in all competitions to Cork City before this season.

Bray Wanderers last victory over Cork City was on the final day of the 2016 season with a 4-1 Premier division win at the Carlisle Grounds. Goal scorers that night were Jason Marks, Dylan Connolly, John Sullivan and Ger Pender.

Honours are even this season between the sides with both previous games this season ending in draws. The sides played out a scoreless draw at the Carlisle Grounds in April. The return fixture in Turners Cross in July ended in a 2-2 draw after Wanderers staged a late recovery from two goals down to snatch a point. Cian Murphy scored both Cork City goals on four and 55 minutes. Darren Craven pulled one back for Wanderers on 83 minutes before Andrew Quinn netted a dramatic equaliser in stoppage time. Wanderers had gone six games without scoring against Cork City prior to this game.

Cian Murphy is Cork's top league goal scorer this season with ten goals to his credit. Joe Doyle is Bray Wanderers top scorer on seven goals.

Cork City are on a good run of form at present. They have lost just one of their last nine league games, a 0-2 home defeat to league leaders Shelbourne. Cork have won three, drawn five and lost once in their last nine league games. They put in impressive performances in their FAI cup campaign this season defeating Sligo Rovers 3-2 away in round 1 before going out to St. Patrick's Athletic in a penalty shootout after a 1-1 draw.

Anything but a win for Cork tonight will end their slim hopes of making a playoff spot.

Dan Jones misses out for Bray tonight due to suspension following his red card away to Cobh Ramblers last week.

Inside the first minute, Emeka Onwubiko had an attempt which was well saved by Michael Devine. Alan Cawley's effort two minutes later was deflected out by Liam Kearney for a corner. Chris Deans' header from the resulting corner was saved by Devine.

Wanderers took the lead following an Alan Cawley free kick which Deans nodded on, and Paddy Kavanagh scored with a spectacular overhead kick which beat Devine. Minutes later, Devine had to be alert to cut out an Onwubiko cross.

The introduction of Cillian Lordan at half time inspired a better Cork performance in the second half. Bray were under pressure especially from several Gareth Farrelly free kicks which were dealt with.

The pressure paid off in the 65th minute when Denis Behan got to a Farrelly cross to head home from close range inside a crowded goalmouth.

Cork was in control after that with Farrelly, Kearney, McSweeney and Woods all having shots on goal.

Bray had a chance from a breakaway when James O'Shea forced Devine into a save. Stephen Fox then shot over while Alan Cawley had the final chance of the game which Devine saved easily.

QUIGLEY'S WORLD OF FOOTBALL

"Chopper"

Would you cycle a Raleigh Chopper to the Nou Camp to see your brother's team play soccer? Perhaps it would be easier to just fly. If you had one of these bicycles in the 1970's then you'll remember it fondly. The design always reminds me of the motorcycles in Easy Rider, elongated saddle and handlebars uniquely high up, Peter Fonda and Dennis Hopper as Captain America and Billy, freewheeling across the USA to get to the New Orleans Mardi Gras.

I wasn't surprised when the Chopper was revived this millennium after 25 years out of production. The original bicycle, with its differently sized wheels [20 inches at the rear and 16 inches at the front], frame-mounted gear shift and long, padded high-backed seat were a symbol of cool when I was a boy [I never had one, although one of my brothers did].

Enough about bicycles, though. There was another 'Chopper' at large at the time, namely Ron 'Chopper' Harris of Chelsea. Harris was a tough-tackling, talented yet uncompromising defender, so 'Chopper' was an apt nickname. He was at Chelsea for an incredibly long time, starting out as an apprentice in 1960 and finishing as a veteran in 1980 with 795 club appearances. He still holds the records at Chelsea for most appearances overall, most appearances in the League and most appearances in the FA Cup.

Harris' haul of medals at Chelsea includes winner's medals in the FA Youth Cup, FA Cup, League Cup and European Cup Winners Cup. For several years in the 1960's he played in the same side as his older brother Allan. Unlike Ron, Allan didn't stay long-term at Chelsea – he also

played for Queen's Park Rangers, Coventry City, Cambridge United, Plymouth Argyle and our own St Patrick's Athletic [seven games in 1976 to bring the curtains down on his playing career].

After his time at Chelsea ended, Ron Harris moved on to Brentford to wind down his career. He tried management [briefly, at Aldershot] before settling down to life as a greyhound trainer. Allan was more successful at soccer management, and between 1984 and 1986 was assistant to Terry Venables at Barcelona. I'm assuming 'Chopper' went over to watch a few games, and that he didn't cycle!

'Chopper' is still alive and well and is now 76. Allan Harris passed away in 2017 aged 74. Prior to moving to Barcelona with Venables, he had assisted him at Crystal Palace and QPR [where they guided the London side to the 1982 FA Cup final and promotion to the old First Division in 1982-83]. At Barcelona La Liga was won in 1984-85 and the 1986 European Cup final reached. Allan subsequently managed in his own right, at Egyptian club Al Ahly where he had African Cup success and with the Malaysian national team.

Finally, I'd like to send good wishes to former Ireland international Joe Kinnear. It was announced recently that Joe is suffering from dementia; unfortunately, this is a condition that is affecting too many former soccer players to ignore. Also, Jimmy Greaves passed away recently. Jimmy was an iconic figure on television in my childhood, alongside Ian St John. Both had been iconic players back in the 1960's and 1970's [St John passed away earlier this year]

Player Profile Dan Jones

Age:34

Dan has made just over 300 league appearances in his career to date. He began his career at Wolverhampton Wanderers Academy and progressed to the youth team before turning professional in January 2005. While with Wolves he had loan spells with Northampton Town, Oldham Athletic, Notts County and Bristol Rovers.

He moved to Sheffield Wednesday in June 2010 and was part of the team that won promotion to the championship in 2011/12.

He joined Port Vale in January 2013 and helped the club to secure promotion out of League Two in 2012–13.

Dan featured in some pre-season fixtures for Bray Wanderers in February 2021. He joined Bray Wanderers on 1st July 2021. He was sent off in last weeks 2-1 win over Cobh Ramblers and will miss tonight's game through suspension.

Not just a Pretty Park

Mícheál Ó hUanacháin looks at the blitz development of Bray a century and a half ago that ended with the Carlisle Grounds

The collapse of the eaves on a number of houses on Goldsmiths Terrace, Quinsboro Road, during the summer reminds us that Bray experienced an unusually rapid development as a town immediately following the arrival of the railway in 1854. It was during that boom that Goldsmiths Terrace was built.

A number of factors fed the growing town, particularly the growth of health and fitness fashions. Ireland had not had a tradition of "taking the waters", the fancy for the health-giving properties of mineral-rich spring waters that had spread throughout Europe in the eighteenth century. Nor had the country enjoyed the growth of a "middle class" that had followed the industrial revolution in England and underpinned the development of coastal towns suitable for sea-bathing, another fashionable and supposedly healthy recreation.

Impressed with the "Great Exhibition of the Works of Industry of All Nations" in London in 1851, for which the Crystal Palace building had been erected in Hyde Park, William Dargan proposed to the Royal Dublin Society that a similar one be mounted in the "second City of Empire". The RDS had elected him a life member that year, in acknowledgment of the hundreds of miles of new Irish railways he had been involved in, which had also made him a rich man. He now offered £20,000 to fund his plan, the equivalent of more than €2.5 million today.

A single building, located on Leinster Lawn, to the East of Leinster House, housed the entire Great Industrial Exhibition of 1853 in Dublin, which lasted from 12 May to 31 October. Queen Victoria, accompanied by the Prince Consort and the Prince of Wales, visited it on 29 August, later calling on Dargan at his home, Mount Anville in south Dublin, and reportedly offering him a baronetcy – which he declined. The architect, John Benson, was knighted.

Dargan wound up paying for the whole exhibition, which had gone way over budget, contemporary accounts speaking of it costing him "sixty to eighty thousand pounds" – and it was a commercial flop.

The following year he arrived in Bray with his latest railway project, and soon realised that the sleepy fishing village had enormous potential. It was already popular with the very rich and would now be accessible for the merely wealthy. John Quin, proprietor of the former Meath Arms, later the Royal Hotel, had acquired the land between there and the new rail line, and he and Dargan, with Edward Breslin and John Brennan, a returned Yank, set about developing the new seaside resort they had imagined.

Dargan was responsible for Duncairn Terrace (originally Dargan Terrace), Prince of Wales Terrace and the much longer Goldsmiths Terrace, Breslin built the Marine Station Hotel opposite what is now the Hibernia Inn, and Brennan developed the International Hotel, once supposedly the biggest hotel in the British Isles. Between them they invented the fashionable end of the town, and their work is the basis of the seaward part of the Quinsboro Road as it is still seen today.

Goldsmiths was the only one of the Quinsboro Road terraces with its doors at street level, and accordingly has suffered most from twentieth century commercial redevelopment.

But that was only part of the plan. Dargan took a strip of land on the sea front on a peppercorn lease from Lord Meath and developed and landscaped it at his own expense to make it convenient not only for "promenading", but also for sea bathing. The weather on the East Coast was highly suitable for the idea of "bracing", meaning healthful, walks, promoted at the time by the new seaside resorts in England. The sea walk was known for years as the Dargan Esplanade. At its northern end, Martello Terrace, right on the sea, was also built at this time, a men's bathing place opened beside it a year later.

Ireland was not noted for mineral springs to base Spa towns on: Lisdoonvarna in Co Clare and Lucan, just west of Dublin, were the only notable establishments of that sort at the time, and Wicklow was no better served. However, a new health fashion was growing, and might serve just as well to attract visitors.


Closely intertwined with bathing and 'taking the waters', hydrotherapy covers all sorts of water treatment: cold showers, steam baths, blanket baths, and many more. Some types of hydrotherapy were highly controversial, but that did not mean it was shunned – on the contrary, it seemed to attract the curious and the easily persuaded.

Dr Edward Haughton was a son of a Dublin businessman who would soon be Chairman of the Great Southern and Western Railway Company, and whom Dargan had known for years. He spent time in Dr Richard Barter's clinic in Blarney as a "weakly and ailing" teenager and became convinced of hydrotherapy's value. In January 1860 he opened a

Hydropathic Establishment in Galtrim House, between Quin's hotel and the railway, formerly the Quin family house and named after the town near their original home in Co Meath.

Haughton's mentor, Dr Barter, had preceded him in another addition to Quinsboro Road, Dargan's idiosyncratic pseudo-oriental Turkish Baths building which had cost £10,000 when it was completed the previous year. Both doctors were convinced of the benefits of their treatments but would probably now be classed as 'quacks': Haughton in particular was very hostile to the new vaccination treatment, a Victorian anti-vaxxer.

Both these "medical" establishments catered to what they hoped would be a growing upper-class clientele similar to that of the original Brighton, on which this new resort was conceptually based. Neither, however, lasted very long, the Baths being converted for Assembly Rooms within a decade, and Bray failing to garner the reputation of a spa town.

1989 Bray Wanderers were defeated 2-1 at home by Home Farm in the First division. Kevin Reynolds scored the Wanderers goal.

1995 Bray Wanderers defeated Waterford United 3-0 in the second leg of

the Shield final at the Carlisle Grounds. Wanderers lost the first leg 3-0 at the Regional Sports centre in Waterford two days earlier. Goal scorers were Philip Gormley (2 -(2 penalties) and Richie Parsons. The game went to extra time and then penalties. In the penalty shootout Kieran O'Brien put Bray one up. John Sayers made it 1-1. Derek O'Neill put bray 2-1 up before Pat Trehy saved from ex-Wanderer Joe Lawless. Pat O'Brien then made it 3-1 to Bray before Trehy saved Brian Barry's effort. Robbie Coyle then saw his penalty saved by Waterford keeper Garlich. Declan Power then scored for Waterford to make to 3-2. It was left to Richie Parsons to score Wanderers final spot kick to win the trophy 4-2 on penalties.





THE CARLISLE GROUNDS GROUND REGULATIONS

Entry to the ground is subject to acceptance by the visitor of these Ground Regulations. Entry to the ground constitutes acceptance of the Ground Regulations, and this shall apply in respect of all events within the Ground.

"Ground" means the Carlisle Grounds and all locations owned, occupied or utilised by Bray Wanderers Football Club.

"Events" means any event taking place at the Carlisle Grounds. "BWFC" means Bray Wanderers Football Club.

- 1. Permission to enter the or to remain within the Ground (not withstanding possession of any ticket) is at the absolute discretion of BWFC, any member of Garda Siochana or authorised steward. On no account will admission to any Event be granted to any person not in possession of a valid ticket. On no account will admission to a Football match be granted to a person who is the subject of a current banning order.
- BWFC excludes to the maximum extent permitted by law any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property in or around the Ground.
- 3. No guarantees can be given to BWFC that an Event will take place at a particular time or on a particular date and BWFC reserves the right to reschedule the Event without notice and without any liability whatsoever.
- 4. In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Event, refunds (If any) should be claimed in accordance with the relevant event organiser's ticket terms and conditions. BWFC will have no other liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited) loss of enjoyment or travel costs.
- 5. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge BWFC's right to search any person whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search
- 6. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground
- 7. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
- 1. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment, or any such banners or flags, is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
- 8 Conviction of any of the following may result in a banning order being made -
- 8.1 The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse
- 8.2 The chanting of anything of an indecent or racialist nature.
- 8.3 The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse.
- 8.4 Attempting to enter the Ground or being inside the ground whilst drunk.
- 8.5 Being in possession of any intoxicating liquor or can or other portable container and which could cause damage or personal injury, when entering the ground or in public area of the Ground from which the event can be directly viewed.
- 9. All persons entering the Ground may only occupy the seat/area allocated to them by their ticket and must not move from any one part of the ground to another without the express permission or instruction of any steward, officer of BWFC and/or any member of An Garda Siochana.
- 10. Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.
- 11. The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and like places is strictly forbidden. Nobody entering the Ground shall be permitted to climb any structures within the Ground.
- 12. Smoking in No-Smoking Areas is strictly forbidden.
- 13. Mobile telephones and other communications devices are permitted within the Ground provided that they are used for personal and private use only.
- 14. Any individual who has entered any part of the Ground designated for the use of any group of supporters to which they do not belong may be ejected from the Ground either for the purpose of their own safety or for any other reason.
- 15. No person (other than a person who holds an appropriate licence) may bring into the Ground or use within the Ground any equipment which, is capable of recording or transmitting (by digital or other means) any audio, visual or audio-visual material or any information or data in relation to the Event or Ground. Copyright in any unauthorised recording or transmission is assigned to BWFC.
- 16. No goods (including literature) of any nature may be offered either free or for sale by any person within the Ground without the express written permission of BWFC.
- 17. Tickets are not transferable and may not be offered for sale without the prior written permission of BWFC. Any tickets offered for sale may be confiscated by any steward or officer of BWFC or any member of An Garda Siochana.
- 18. At all times while present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward and/or member of An Garda Siochana. Failure to comply with any instruction may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.
- 19. BWFC reserves absolutely the right to eject from the Ground any person failing to comply with any of the Ground Regulations or whose presence within the Ground is, or could, reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. This could lead to further action including, but not limited to, a ban from the Ground or proceedings being taken.
- 20. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of the ground Regulations.


