MATCH PREVIEW – Michael Duffy

Bray Wanderers go into tonight's game on their poorest run of the season. The Seagulls lost their last three league games of the season and have lost five of their last seven league games recording just one win and one draw in that run.

Meetings between Bray Wanderers and Galway United are even so far this season with each team recording a win, a draw, and a defeat from the three league games this season.

Bray won 2-1 at Eamonn Deacy park in the first meeting of the teams this year in May. Joe Doyle put Wanderers ahead on six minutes before Ruairi Keating equalised on 34 minutes. Gary Shaw headed the winner for Bray one minute into stoppage time at the end of the game.

The sides played out a scoreless draw in the league meeting at the Carlisle Grounds in July.

Wilson Waweru scored the only goal of the game eight minutes from time when the sides met at Eamonn Deacy park last month.

Bray Wanderers failed to score against Galway United in three games last season – twice in the league and once in the play off when Galway defeated Wanderers 1-0 at the Carlisle Grounds in October 2020. Bray have failed to score in five of the last six meetings between the sides.

Tonight's game will be the third time the sides have met each other in a league play off. Galway have won both previous playoff encounters 1-0.

The sides met in a premier division relegation play off in November 2010 in Eamonn Deacy Park which Galway won by a Karl Sheppard goal. Wilson Waweru scored the only goal in last season's promotion play off at the Carlisle Grounds eight minutes from time.

Callum Thompson will miss tonight's game for Bray due to suspension for his sending off in the 4-2 away defeat to Wexford FC last Friday. Mark Byrne returns to the squad having missed the Wexford defeat through suspension.

Galway will be missing Francely Lomboto and Ronan Manning due to injury, but Gary Boylan, Ruairi Keating and Stephen Walsh all return from suspension for tonight's game.

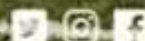

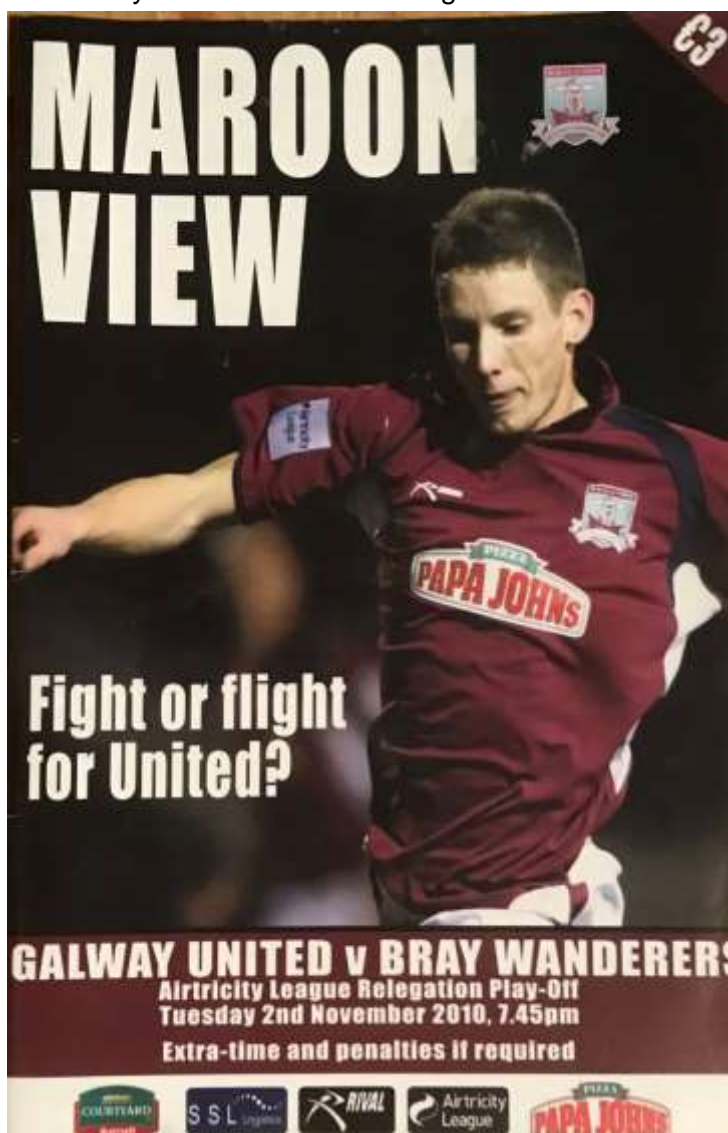
Galway United 1 Bray Wanderers 0

Relegation Play Off

Drogheda United finished bottom of the premier division in 2010 and were automatically relegated. Galway United finished in eighth place which gave them home advantage in a relegation play off one leg game against Bray Wanderers who finished in ninth place. The loser of the play off would then face First Division Monaghan United over two legs for a place in the premier division for the following season.

Wanderers suffered a late loss of Shane O'Connor just before the kick-off. An early attack by Bray saw Gary Shaw head just wide from a Chris Shields cross. Minutes later Jason Molloy shot wide for Galway after a quick counterattack. Wanderers had further chances in the opening ten minutes through Jake Kelly, Gary Shaw and Daire Doyle. On the quarter hour, Matt Gregg could only parry a Derek O'Brien header into Karl Sheppard's path, and he duly fired to the net. Just past the half hour, Gregg saved well under from Sheppard after the striker latched onto a ball over the defence.

Wanderers lost Chris Shields at half time through injury. Bray started the second half well with chances for Jake Kelly who shot wide after a good run and Shaw then forced Ryan into a good save.



Wanderers pressed for an equaliser and a couple of Gary Dempsey free kicks caused problems for the Galway defence

Derek O'Brien shot over for Galway with only Gregg to beat after a good run by substitute Tom King with under a quarter of an hour to go.

Bray were reduced to ten men on 81 minutes when Adam Mitchell received a second yellow card for fouling Sheppard. Galway finished with ten men as well when Derek O'Brien received a second yellow two minutes into added time.

QUIGLEY'S WORLD OF FOOTBALL

Safety In Numbers

In the late 1970's there were very few footballers in English professional soccer from outside the UK and Ireland. So much so that it seemed to me at the time that whenever someone from further afield did arrive, they came in numbers. There's safety in numbers.

I'm thinking specifically of Osvaldo Ardiles and Ricardo Villa arriving together at White Hart Lane as World Cup Winners from Argentina in 1978 to play for Tottenham Hotspur. And the Yugoslav goalkeepers Peter Borota and Raddy Avramovic, who arrived at Chelsea and Notts County in summer 1979. Also, Dutchmen Arnold Muhren and Franz Thijssen arriving together at Portman Road around that time to play for Bobby Robson's Ipswich Town, then a major force in English and European soccer.

My memory is playing tricks on me in the case of Muhren and Thijssen. They didn't actually arrive together. They had been teammates at Dutch club FC Twente and Muhren moved to England first, in 1978. Thijssen joined him a year later.

Like Ardiles and Villa at Spurs, Muhren and Thijssen both impressed at Ipswich. Really impressed. So much so that they were successive winners of Ipswich's Player of the Year award – Muhren in 1979 and Thijssen in 1980. There was stiff competition for the award at the time given the greatness of Ipswich's squad – names like George Burley, Mick Mills, Paul Mariner, Kevin Beattie, Terry Butcher, John Wark and Paul Cooper.

Admiration for the pair wasn't confined to East Anglia. In 1981 Thijssen became the first Dutchman to be voted English Footballer of the Year as he helped Ipswich to the UEFA Cup [he

scored in both legs of the final against Dutch club AZ Alkmaar] and second place in the First Division.

Muhren and Thijssen were pursued by other English clubs, especially after Robson left Ipswich in 1982 to deservedly take up the England job. Muhren left first, for Old Trafford, where he helped Manchester United to an FA Cup win in 1983. He stayed in Manchester until 1985 before returning to Ajax [who he had played for previously between 1971 and 1974] where more success awaited him – a 1987 European Cup Winners Cup win, together with his 1981 UEFA Cup win with Ipswich and his 1973 European Cup win during his first spell at Ajax gave him the complete set of UEFA club medals [Danny Blind is the only other Dutch player to have same].

Thijssen moved on from Ipswich to Nottingham Forest, but his time at The City Ground was unhappy and unsuccessful and lasted only months. He went back to The Netherlands too, playing for Fortuna Sitrad, FC Groningen and Vitesse Arnhem as he wound down his career.

Thijssen and Muhren were occasional teammates too in the Dutch national team. Thijssen won 14 caps between 1975 and 1981, while Muhren won 23 between 1978 and 1988. Muhren, at 37, was still playing when Holland won the 1988 Euros, supplying the cross for Marco van Basten's super volley in the final against the Soviet Union.

One for a pub quiz to finish. Apart from Thijssen and Muhren, two other Dutch players have won Ipswich's Player of the Year award. Can you name them without reading on? Well, they were Romeo Zondervan in 1987 and Fabian Wilnis in 2006. Might come in handy one day!

PLAYER PROFILE: DYLAN BARNETT

Age: 24

Bray native, Dylan is a left back who began his career as a left winger. He played underage football with St Joseph's Boys before moving to England to play for Brighton & Hove Albion's underage teams in 2013. He played for their under 18s and under 21s from July 2015 and made 5 league appearances for Brighton's under 23s in season 2016/2017. He left Brighton in May 2017 and returned to Ireland.

Dylan appeared for Bray Wanderers during the pre-season fixtures in 2018 before signing for newly promoted Waterford FC for the 2018 season. He made 32 league appearances for Waterford in the premier division in 2018.

He has been capped by the Republic of Ireland at underage level. He featured in the Ireland Under 17 squad for the UEFA Championships Elite Qualifying Round in March 2013. He then played in the under 18 friendlies against the Czech Republic and at under 19 level against Mexico in May 2014. He played against Serbia under 19s in June 2014 in a 3-1 defeat for Ireland at the Tallaght stadium in a UEFA under 19 qualifier.

Dylan joined Bray Wanderers in December 2018. He was the Player of the year in 2020.

Dylan featured in the RTE series "Our Town" earlier this year. The series which was filmed over 18 months to the end of 2020, and followed the hopes, dreams, challenges, and joys of a diverse bunch of young people from Bray.

Now up, now down

Mícheál Ó hUanacháin on the age-old argument about promotion and relegation

Shamrock Rovers Champions, Shelbourne going up, Longford going down, and although things may have become clearer after Monday night's games, as I write any one of five Premier teams doomed to face the winner of a First Division four-team dog-fight. Is this the best way to end a football season?

Promotion and relegation were by no means unknown in the domestic game in the early years of the League of Ireland, then known as the Free State League. Most if not all of the junior and intermediate leagues which had more than one division operated such systems (as, of course, did the English league), but there were obvious problems to be faced if it were to be built into a single-division league.

That didn't stop many of the pundits of the time arguing in its favour, even if they seldom agreed on the details. During the 1930s, in particular, there were regular calls for it to be established in relation to the Free State League.

That league had an automatic drop-out system, whereby the bottom two teams were eliminated, and had to "seek re-election" if they wished to stay in the League. But while that was by no means unopposed in the early years, over time it became almost a formality.

Towards the end of the 1926/27 season, 'Nat' (William Stanbridge) in the *Evening Herald* was looking at Shamrock Rovers' outstanding performance that year: "Rovers, it may be remembered, became seniors in the season of 1921-22, and right away won the Leinster League, reached the final of the Free State Cup, in which they were beaten by the Gate after a draw, and were also runners up in the Metropolitan Cup. A year later on promotion they won the Free State League."

While Rovers were not exactly "promoted" into the League, it became almost routine that the teams

with strong regional performances under their belt were the ones most likely to take any vacancies that occurred in the LOI.

Drumcondra, who had come through the Qualifying Cup to win the Senior Cup that year, would be admitted to the League at the end of the season that followed. In the meantime, the League had decided not to extend their ten-team membership, to the bitter disappointment of Bendigo "as they felt they had an undisputed claim to inclusion as winners, two years in succession, of the Leinster Senior League" ('Nat' again, in August 1927).

In the same month 'Pivot', in the *Irish Independent* (who I suspect may have been W.P. Murphy) and 'Nomad' in the *Dublin Sport* (another enthusiast for the system) both indicate that there had been a proposal for promotion and relegation before the League at the meeting which decided against extension, and it too had been defeated.

'Nat' returned, obliquely, to the topic at the end of the 1930/31 season, arguing that there was a need for "some form of test to ensure that readmission of bottom teams won't be merely automatic as at present." His answer was to propose (not for the first time) "an inter-county competition for the provinces, the winners of which would have the right to promotion the following season."

He revisited the subject in August 1931, reporting on the rise of the game in Kerry – with "already 16 junior clubs, and others in course of formation" as a highlight of a recent conference of Munster and south Leinster enthusiasts, and touted the regionalisation of early rounds of an inter-county tournament "in order to minimise the troubles of travelling".

In the middle of the 1932-33 season, 'Socaró' (P.A. McKenna) in the *Irish Press* (which given its provenance gave surprisingly generous coverage

to the "garrison game") described the re-admission process as a myth, but argued that "it would be very difficult to evolve a promotion and relegation system." Few of the current clubs outside the League would be strong enough financially, or have grounds which would meet the requirements of the League, he said – and doesn't that sound familiar?

In September 1933, in the course of a puff piece on the Queens Park club, the *Irish Press* was implicitly backing some system of promotion from the Leinster Senior League into the League of Ireland.

In December 1934, the prolific Linfield striker Joe Bambrick (yes, he who scored 6 goals for the IFA's "Ireland" against Wales in 1930) noted shortly after moving to Chelsea that there wasn't the same keenness among Irish players: "... there is not the same competition. There is no promotion or relegation ...", and while he was undoubtedly thinking primarily of the Irish League, the Free State League was in the same boat.

'Nat' was to tout the promotion/relegation idea for several years as a panacea for whatever was wrong with the League – in 1935 in the form of an Intermediate League; in 1936 winning the Munster or Leinster Senior Leagues were the proposed promotion routes; in 1937 the prospect of relegation as a corrective to clubs' complaints of falling 'gates' (attendance). "What is wanted," he said anent this last, "is to lift the standard of

football, make every match vital, and the 'gates' will look after themselves."

But the chorus in favour of a promotion/relegation system fell away, and even when a second League of Ireland division was established in the 1960s, there was no talk of such, possibly because the B-Division was essentially a Leinster league, numerically dominated by the reserve teams of the Leinster-based LOI clubs.

So, the difficult process of devising a promotion and relegation system was avoided until the decision was made in 1984 to establish a two-division structure for the LOI. That made everything simple: they could just imitate the English league, with a hybrid of automatic promotion and relegation, and playoffs for additional places.

THE CARLISLE GROUNDS

GROUND REGULATIONS

Entry to the ground is subject to acceptance by the visitor of these Ground Regulations. Entry to the ground constitutes acceptance of the Ground Regulations, and this shall apply in respect of all events within the Ground.

"Ground" means the Carlisle Grounds and all locations owned, occupied or utilised by Bray Wanderers Football Club.

"Events" means any event taking place at the Carlisle Grounds. "BWFC" means Bray Wanderers Football Club.

1. Permission to enter the or to remain within the Ground (notwithstanding possession of any ticket) is at the absolute discretion of BWFC, any member of Garda Síochána or authorised steward. On no account will admission to any Event be granted to any person not in possession of a valid ticket. On no account will admission to a Football match be granted to a person who is the subject of a current banning order.
2. BWFC excludes to the maximum extent permitted by law any liability for loss, injury or damage to persons/property in or around the Ground.
3. No guarantees can be given to BWFC that an Event will take place at a particular time or on a particular date and BWFC reserves the right to reschedule the Event without notice and without any liability whatsoever.
4. In the event of the postponement or abandonment of the Event, refunds (If any) should be claimed in accordance with the relevant event organiser's ticket terms and conditions. BWFC will have no other liability whatsoever, including (but not limited to) any indirect or consequential loss or damage, such as (but not limited to) loss of enjoyment or travel costs.
5. All persons seeking entrance to the Ground acknowledge BWFC's right to search any person whether outside or inside the Ground and to refuse entry to or eject from the Ground any person refusing to submit to such a search
6. The following articles must not be brought within the Ground – knives, fireworks, smoke canisters, air-horns, flares, weapons, dangerous or hazardous items, laser devices, bottles, glass vessels, cans, poles and any article that might be used as a weapon and/or compromise public safety. Any person in possession of such items will be refused entry to the Ground.
7. The use of threatening behaviour, foul or abusive language is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
1. Racial, homophobic or discriminatory abuse, chanting or harassment, or any such banners or flags, is strictly forbidden and will result in arrest and/or ejection from the Ground. BWFC may impose a ban from the Ground as a result.
8. Conviction of any of the following may result in a banning order being made –
 - 8.1 The throwing of any object within the Ground without lawful authority or excuse
 - 8.2 The chanting of anything of an indecent or racist nature.
 - 8.3 The entry onto the playing area or any adjacent area to which spectators are not generally admitted without lawful authority or excuse.
 - 8.4 Attempting to enter the Ground or being inside the ground whilst drunk.
 - 8.5 Being in possession of any intoxicating liquor or can or other portable container and which could cause damage or personal injury, when entering the ground or in public area of the Ground from which the event can be directly viewed.
9. All persons entering the Ground may only occupy the seat/area allocated to them by their ticket and must not move from any one part of the ground to another without the express permission or instruction of any steward, officer of BWFC and/or any member of An Garda Síochána.
10. Nobody may stand in any seating area whilst play is in progress. Persistent standing in seated areas whilst play is in progress is strictly forbidden and may result in ejection from the Ground.
11. The obstruction of gangways, access ways, exits and entrances, stairways and like places is strictly forbidden. Nobody entering the Ground shall be permitted to climb any structures within the Ground.
12. Smoking in No-Smoking Areas is strictly forbidden.
13. Mobile telephones and other communications devices are permitted within the Ground provided that they are used for personal and private use only.
14. Any individual who has entered any part of the Ground designated for the use of any group of supporters to which they do not belong may be ejected from the Ground either for the purpose of their own safety or for any other reason.
15. No person (other than a person who holds an appropriate licence) may bring into the Ground or use within the Ground any equipment which, is capable of recording or transmitting (by digital or other means) any audio, visual or audio-visual material or any information or data in relation to the Event or Ground. Copyright in any unauthorised recording or transmission is assigned to BWFC.
16. No goods (including literature) of any nature may be offered either free or for sale by any person within the Ground without the express written permission of BWFC.
17. Tickets are not transferable and may not be offered for sale without the prior written permission of BWFC. Any tickets offered for sale may be confiscated by any steward or officer of BWFC or any member of An Garda Síochána.
18. At all times while present in the Ground, persons must comply with any and all instructions of any steward and/or member of An Garda Síochána. Failure to comply with any instruction may lead to immediate ejection from the Ground.
19. BWFC reserves absolutely the right to eject from the Ground any person failing to comply with any of the Ground Regulations or whose presence within the Ground is, or could, reasonably be construed as constituting a source of danger, nuisance or annoyance to any other person. This could lead to further action including, but not limited to, a ban from the Ground or proceedings being taken.
20. Entry to the Ground shall constitute acceptance of the ground Regulations.
